Summer 2024 Recreation Wrap Up

The 2024 Summer has come to an end and what a fun summer it was! The Tuolumne County Recreation Department had a very busy summer with popular annual programs as well as some exciting new ones. Every summer it is our goal to offer a wide range of programs for our community to take part in, learn, and grow. From youth sports camps such as Tennis, Fastpitch, Water Polo, Swim, Basketball, and Baseball, to mental and emotional enrichment programs such as Senior and Youth Yoga and Children's Movement classes, The Summer Rec Program, Paint Parties, Crafts, and the Tiny Tots Summer Camps, the Recreation Department strives to provide something for everyone. The Recreation Department's ever popular Summer Aquatics Program brought Aquatic Fitness, The Mother Lode Miners Swim Team, and of course our Swim Lessons program, which the Recreation Department, staff, and instructors had a great time working with and providing for the community.

Some highlights from this summer include: increasing our Mother Lode Miners Swim team from 23 to 76 athletes, providing over 800 swim lessons to the youth of our county, seeing our highest numbers in our Summer Recreation Program at Soulsbyville Elementary School since prior to Covid, the certification of over 20 new lifeguards, creating a Tuolumne Recreation Art Series, sold out all of our Tiny Tots Summer Camp spots in all five sessions and increasing the number of mental and emotional well-being programs offered. This summer we were also able to offer extended summer hours at the Twain Harte Pool, where we offered Aquafit, Rec Swim, and Family Game Nights throughout August and September. We will continue to work with this momentum as we try to offer more every year, and improve on what we already offer. It is our goal to always be improving and adding to our catalog and to offer what the community wants to participate in.
