

I completed two years at a community college with studies in environmental science (or geology or biology or another technical study area). Is there a position for me with the Environmental Health Division at Tuolumne County?

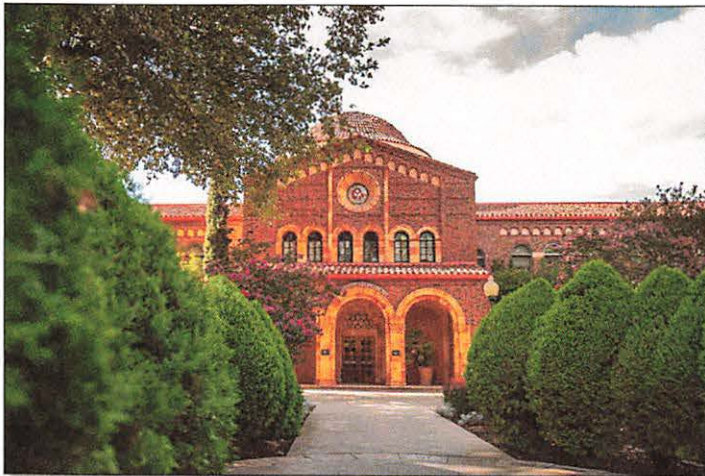
Yes, there is!

Our Environmental Health Technician position is well suited for someone with at least 12 semester units of college coursework that includes environmental studies, chemistry, biology, geology, toxicology, or related field and two years' experience in work related to a technical field.



I am ready to graduate from a four-year college with a degree in an Environmental Studies or related to one of the earth or life sciences. Is there a position for me with the Environmental Health Division at Tuolumne County?

Yes, there is!



Depending on the course you took, you may qualify as an Environmental Health Specialist One position. This is determined by sending your college transcripts to the California Department of Public Health (CDPH). CDPH will determine the amount of training hours you will need to be eligible to take the exam to become registered by the state as a Registered Environmental Health Specialist.

Before the exam, while you are being trained, you would work as an Environmental Health Specialist One. After passing the exam, you would be promoted to an Environmental Health Specialist Two position.
