I am pleased to submit, in accordance with Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code, Tuolumne County's Annual Crop and Livestock Report for 2022. This report provides a statistical description of Tuolumne County's agricultural production. The figures contained in this report represent gross values of agricultural commodities and do not reflect production costs or

The 2022 value of agricultural commodities produced in Tuolumne County is estimated at \$30,923,681. This is an 18.81% decrease from last year's production value of \$37,344,673. Overall timber production decreased 35.5% due to resources for timber harvesting being allocated outside of Tuolumne County, specifically within the Caldor Fire burn scar. The Agricultural production, excluding harvested timber, was valued at \$20,715,660 which is a decrease of 9.3% from the 2021 value. Hay and Irrigated Pasture value increased by 20.85% and 34.56% respectively due to the increase in forage values. Miscellaneous Fruit and Vegetables decreased by 29% due to the late Spring frost. Apiary and Nursery product sales decreased by 115% largely due to the end of the pandemic, which saw a large decrease in nursery sales. Livestock and Poultry, the County's leading production category, was valued at \$16,472,935.06 which decreased by 12.27% from 2021 values.

I wish to express my appreciation to the agricultural producers, organizations, and public agencies that have cooperated in providing data for this report. I would like to express my sincere thanks to the Agricultural Commissioner staff who compiled and designed the report. I would also like to thank our Tuolumne County Agricultural Industry and Tuolumne County Farm Bureau for reference material.
