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Additional Location Identified for Potential Measles Exposure

Tuolumne County, CA – As the Public Health Department continues its investigation surrounding the [two confirmed cases of measles in the county](#), an additional location for potential exposure to the disease has been identified.

Sonora Sports and Fitness Center’s Athletic Center (back gym) and associated locker rooms and restrooms and Aquatic Center (back pool) has been identified for potential exposure to measles on **March 10th, 2025, between the hours of 3:00 P.M. and 7:00 P.M.** Visitors and staff who were in these areas during this timeframe may have been exposed to measles. These individuals should review their measles vaccination status and monitor themselves for [signs and symptoms](#), including fever, cough, runny nose, red & watery eyes, rash 3-5 days after other signs of illness. Should a person develop any symptoms, contact your healthcare provider immediately.

As a reminder, measles is a highly contagious disease, and Public Health is taking immediate steps to prevent further spread. This includes close coordination with impacted locations, including previously shared, Summerville High School and Adventist Health Sonora. Public Health is actively working to identify and contact anyone who may have been exposed to the cases, especially those at highest risk.

Those at highest risk include:

- Unvaccinated individuals, especially young children
- Pregnant women
- Those with weakened immune systems
- Infants under 12 months of age
