- (c) May be temporarily reassigned to a different shift, generally a normal businesshours shift, during the investigation. The employee may always be required to remain available for contact during such shift, and will report as ordered



Deputies investigating an individual who is suspected of committing a minor criminal offense and who is being taken on a 5150 commitment should resolve the criminal matter by issuing a warning or a Notice to Appear as appropriate. When an individual who may qualify for a 5150 commitment has committed a serious criminal offense that would normally result in an arrest and transfer to a jail facility, the deputy should:

- (a) Arrest the individual when there is probable cause to do so.
- (b) Notify the appropriate supervisor of the facts supporting the arrest and the facts that would support the 5150 commitment.
- (c) Facilitate the individual's transfer to jail.
- (d) Thoroughly document in the related reports the circumstances that indicate the individual may qualify for a 5150 commitment.

In the supervisor's judgment, the individual may instead be arrested or booked and transported to the appropriate mental health facility. The supervisor should consider the seriousness of the offense, the treatment options available, the ability of this office to regain custody of the individual, office resources (e.g., posting a guard) and other relevant factors in making this decision.

I have completed the internal affairs investigation of the Use of Force incident in the Tuolumne County Jail that occurred on November 9 th , 2020.
SUMMARY OF COMPLAINT:
On 11-9-20, Acting Jail Commander, Sergeant stated he just witnessed a use of force that may have been excessive. On 11-10-20, Sergeant delivered corresponding reports and video surveillance to Lt. Vasquez. We reviewed the video footage of the incident. Inmate was sitting on the half wall of Sobering Cell 4. It appeared was told to get off the wall on at least two different occasions. 6 Deputies went into the cell to remove from the half wall. jumped off the wall toward deputies, was pushed to the ground and Deputies and Green moved their bodies to control upper torso. Deputy Green appeared to have been struck in the face by foot. At this point, was on his back. Deputy was attempting to gain control of left side. Other deputies were attempting to control form and legs. Deputy Green delivered a combination of 7 punches and "hammer" punches to left side of his face and head over a twelve second period. The physical encounter lasted a total of 2:58 minutes before was carried to Safety Cell 3.
BACKGROUND:

As a result of this investigation, Deputy Green was demoted from corporal to deputy.

The alleged TCSO, Tuolumne County policy and DSA MOU violations are as follows:



INVESTIGATION:
On 11-9-20, Undersheriff Evans told the Professional Standards Division about a call he received from Sgt. Sgt. told Undersheriff Evans he had just witnessed a use of force incident that was questionable. Sgt. continued telling Undersheriff Evans about the incident when Undersheriff Evans told Sgt. to stop speaking and to submit what he had to the Professional Standards Division. On 11-10-20, Sgt. brought Lt. Vasquez jail incident reports and video footage of an incident that took place on 11-9-20. Lt. Vasquez, Deputy and I watched the video footage. During the footage, Inmate was standing on the half wall in Sobering Cell 4. It appeared and was later confirmed, was told to get off the wall by jail deputies. Ultimately did not comply. Deputies entered the cell and as they did, jumped off the wall toward deputies with his arms and legs extended. went to the ground on his back as deputies got on top of him. Deputies tried gaining control of extremities. Deputy Green punched 7 times in twelve seconds on or around his face.

On 11-9-20, at about 1054 hours, Deputy was working as the classification deputy. He heard deputies yelling at an inmate. Deputy responded and saw sitting on the half wall of Sobering Cell 4. It told deputies they would have to make him get down. Sgt. ordered deputies to remove and place him into Safety Cell 3. Deputies and Green entered the cell. kicked Deputy Green in the face. refused to listen to commands and was "extremely combative". Deputy Green struck 3 times with a closed fist in the face. Deputy was able to gain control of legs. Deputy placed leg shackles on Deputies and Carried to Safety Cell 3. Deputy had control of Robison's right arm. was yelling and appeared to be combative. 
stated he had stated. On the intake medical form, the forms asked for observations of the interviewer (deputy). For mental status, "Alert" was documented. For behavior, "uncooperative" was marked. For physical appearance, "relaxed" was marked. For gait, "normal" was marked. The last question was "Did the arresting officer indicate medical or mental health concerns?" Deputy wrote, "Crazy".
In the nurse's medical forms which were dated 11-9-20 at 0945 hours, denied drug and alcohol use. There was notes about a swollen ankle and scrapes and abrasions to palms.
There was an additional medical form for "On-site Emergency Response Record". The notes stated, "Became combative with staff. Pt placed in safety cell." "Pt reports cardiovascular. Reported earlier in the day that his heart stopped twice before while he was in Texas. Unable to retrieve his medical records at this time." In regard to the nurse checking his eyes, the notes say, "Pt would not open his eyes, in fact he clinched them shut at first. As this nurse started to walk away, he opened his eyes and directed a question to custody staff. Pt uncooperative with pupil check". Additionally, "This nurse able to note size and shape of pupils but pt uncooperative with light accommodation and reactiveness". There was not any other real notable notes from the form.
Video Review of Incident Summary

Nurse Interview Summary
On 12-1-20, at about 0855 hours, Lt. Vasquez and I interviewed Nurse regarding her involvement with Inmate on 11-9-20. Nurse told us the following in summary.
Nurse is a registered nurse and has been employed by CFMG since 2007. She has worked in the Tuolumne County Jail a couple different times and most recently since March 2020. With the intake process, deputies notify medical staff if any sections are answered yes in the medical portion. In had high blood pressure and a swollen ankle, so she had to screen had 2-3 superficial abrasions on his hands. It is said he was not under the influence of drugs or alcohol. Nurse is stated if she had to "guess", she believed was under the influence of methamphetamine. This was based off an elevated heart rate, fidgety, and is being angry. It is was "short and blunt" in answering questions. He was cooperative but not friendly. Nurse is completed all her medical tasks required for its Nurse is was not aware, nor could she tell if the had any mental health issues.
The only mental health services offered to inmates are for inmates who are suicidal and placed into the safety cell. did not make any suicidal statements. Nurse did not know why was placed into Sobering Cell 4.




























Deputy Green has been with the Sheriff's office for 14 years. He is currently a Transportation Deputy and has been for 6 months. He has been a Classification Deputy for about 1.5 years, and a Corporal for about 1.5 years. As a Corporal, Deputy Green was never the Officer in Charge. Every time he was on, there was a sergeant on. As far as collateral duties, Deputy Green is an Impact Weapons instructor and has been for 5 years, was a Defensive tactics instructor, and was trained in cell extractions. Deputy Green was a defensive tactics instructor for a "couple of years". He attended a cell extraction about 6 years ago and held two courses within the sheriff's office.


Deputy Green is familiar with use of force. He knows Penal Code 835a regulates use of force and is familiar with TCSO Policy 300, use of force. Deputy Green is aware, "for the most part", of the newer state changes in the use of force. Deputy Green explained totality of circumstances. He said, "The overall circumstance on whether it was necessary to use force or not." I gave examples of totality of circumstances such as, what the suspect is doing, how many deputies are present, and the size of suspect versus deputy. When I asked if he had a good understanding of it, he stated, "Yes". He takes into consideration the totality of circumstances prior to using force.


Deputy Green explained defensive tactics as a class put on by POST or STC that teaches control holds, de-escalation, and other things to defend themselves to include punches, strikes and kicks. Impact weapons are not included in this.

Deputy Green attended a jail academy and was taught a brief portion of defensive tactics. He was also taught about use of force. Deputy Green was trained as a defensive tactic's instructor in 2015. The course was 2 weeks and he had never recertified. In the course he was taught "hundreds and thousands" of control holds, escapes from chokes, punches, kicks, hostage situations, and weapon takeaways. Deputy Green was part of a newly formed defensive tactics team with the sheriff's office. Prior to being sent to training for the team which taught a different style of defensive tactics, Deputy Green was removed due to budget cuts. Deputy Green has not been to a defensive tactics course in two to three years and at that time he was an instructor. Deputy Green believes it had been about two years since he took a defensive tactics course that was taught by Cpl. during an in-house training day.

Deputy Green has been taught de-escalation. He explained what de-escalation was. The instructor course went over de-escalation and he believes the policy covers it.

Deputy Green described his cell extraction course. He said they learned how to extract someone in tight quarters, and how to work in teams. Deputy Green has been a part of 3 to 4 cell extractions that included gearing up and utilizing a shield. The last one he was involved in was about 3 years ago.






asked Deputy Green if strikes to the face could be deadly. Jason Jasmine interjected and said that was a broad question and that anything could be deadly. In response to the question if strikes to face could be deadly, Deputy Green stated, "I suppose so".

Lt. Vasquez asked if there are zones for strikes. Zones are areas where strikes should be used. Deputy Green said there was not zones for strikes but for impact weapons. Lt. Vasquez said, "In defensive tactics when your taught and teaching students do you teach them that striking someone in the thigh is the same as striking someone in the face is the same level of force? Deputy Green paused and said, "I would think it would be". The question was then rephrased. Deputy Green believes the face would show more injury than the thigh depending on the severity of how hard you hit them. The question was then rephrased for the third time. Deputy Green said the head would be a greater force than the thigh. Deputy Green agreed the fist could be an impact weapon.

I told Deputy Green about all of his qualifications and experience and asked, "Given the totality of circumstances of this particular incident was this use of force reasonable?" Deputy Green answered. "Yes". I asked Deputy Green what he was basing his answer on. He said, "Basing it on my perspective, cause I was there. Whether it be you were saying punching in the thigh or face, at that point that is all I had, I couldn't hit him in the body, I couldn't do nothing because, I am a big guy, I can't, you know, the wall is right there. I believe because every time I accounted for those strikes, I hit him twice and he was still fighting... I believe."



I asked Deputy Green what injuries he had after he came out of the cell. Deputy Green said, "My eye was red, um, and right here the, um, the cheek bone was just swollen. It was, my eye was burning, and I was kind of freaking out cause he was barefoot, and I didn't want to get nothing, you know." Deputy Green sought medical assistance. Cpl. filled out paperwork and Deputy Green went to prompt care at about 1330 hours. Deputy Green told the doctor what happened, and he was told he had an "orbital contusion". Another deputy took pictures of Deputy Green and sent them to him via email. Deputy Green was present when some point, Deputy Green held legs down when the nurse came in to look at was assessed by the nurse. He could not remember if anything while he was in the cell. He believed someone put leg shackles back on When Deputy Green first went into the cell, he thought was conscious. Lt. Vasquez asked Deputy Green if his strikes render unconscious. Deputy Green said, "No". Lt. Vasquez asked if was still moving and talking after the last volley of strikes. Deputy Green said, "Ya, cause he was awake after that. Cause I remember when I laid on his arm, he was he was still looking around at everybody." Deputy Green said there was not a criminal complaint completed on Jail deputies do not write criminal reports often. Deputy Green brought up the fact about doing criminal charges the next day with Cpl. and nothing happened. Deputy Green authored a jail incident report. Lt. Vasquez asked Deputy Green who made the decision to go to prompt care. Deputy Green said, "I made the decision." Nobody told him to go to prompt care, but supervisors did suggest filling out the paperwork. Deputy Green could not recall discussing the incident with any other deputies to include Cpl. Deputy Green did not discuss the incident with Sgt. and there was no team debrief. I asked Deputy Green if he discussed the incident with any other deputies. Deputy Green said, "No, I was real quiet about it." I asked, "Why was that?" Just cause everything happened, and you know, it's still, I don't know, its, I really don't discuss anything." Lt. Vasquez asked Deputy Green if he was nervous about his use of force. Deputy Green said, "No, I did not feel nervous about my use of force. Um, it was just my eye and everything else. I just did not know why I needed to discuss it with anybody. I remember just going to hospital. I was there for a while and came back and wrote my report."

Lt. Vasquez said, "You did not tell anyone that you were nervous about this going to IA and that you had already reached out to legal representation?" Deputy Green said, "Um, I don't remember saying that? But as far as legal representation, I would never would have reached out until the time." In reference to legal representation, Lt. Vasquez specified the time Deputy Green may have reached out to legal representation which was right after the use of force. Deputy Green said, "Might have said I was nervous, um, but I just, I would not say anything about legal representation. Lt. Vasquez said, "So it's your statement that you didn't make the statement about reaching out to legal representation about regarding this specific use of force to anybody?" Deputy Green said, "No. I wouldn't have reached out to an attorney or anything."


We took a short break at this time. When we were back on record, I said to Deputy Green, "After you delivered the seven strikes, you just laid on his arm." Deputy Green quietly said, "Ya I believe, Ya." I asked, "Why didn't you just lay on his arm to begin with." Deputy Green said, "Well, I laid... From where I was, his arm, I laid like this on him. But when his arm was free, I couldn't get his arm. I couldn't just flop my body on him. You know, I was just trying with my hands to grab his arms." I asked, "Why couldn't you just flop your body on him and use your body weight to pin his arm down?" Jason Jasmine interjected and said, "He previously said he stopped resisting after he delivered the last of the strikes, which the arm would have stopped moving. You can't lay on an arm if it is doing this." (moving arm around) Lt. Vasquez said he would like to hear Deputy Green say arm was flailing if that was his "answer". I asked the question again. Deputy Green said, "It wasn't an option, cause he was flailing, waving his arm around." I asked if the arm was waving at the side. Deputy Green said it was waving to "the side, up, and toward me, everything." There was no way he could have pinned his arm with his body weight at the time. Once stopped, Deputy Green was able to lay across and pinned his arm.
















person who is actively fighting." I told her I understood but again told her of her training, rank, and defensive instructor status and asked if the force was reasonable? She said, "I wouldn't have done it the same." I asked her what she would have done. Cpl. said, "I would, I would have, I don't know, just used, I don't know, I don't know what I would have done actually cause I wasn't in there but I don't feel like me as that person I wouldn't have. It depends on where you're at. I don't know. I am answering this question horribly wrong." Lt. Vasquez reminded her that she is a supervisor and explained part of her responsibilities was to evaluate. Cpl.
was asked to articulate her answer. Cpl. said, "So part of, part of it was reasonable yes. Part of it was reasonable force. Um the striking specifically, I probably, I don't feel like the number of strikes, probably but the overcoming of resistance and the utilization of the number of deputies based on the amount of resistance given."
Lt. Vasquez asked Sgt. "Based on everything you have seen you believe it is excessive force." Sgt. said, "I didn't say that. I said it is definitely questionable." Lt. Vasquez said, "I'm asking you." Sgt, said, "Oh sorry, Okay sorry. That's a tough one. I don't know I'm still stuck in the I don't know." "I wanted to prevent it from becoming excessive force." Sgt. could not come to a determination if the force was excessive. He was not sure because he does not have all the facts. He wanted more information and questions answered before he could formulate an opinion. He felt two strikes and "we wouldn't be having this conversation."
I told Deputy about all her training and experience and asked her if the use of force used by Deputy Green was reasonable. Deputy said, "I don't believe so". I asked what she was basing it off of? Deputy said, "The amount of us, the sizes of some of us even though Mr. although he to me, is tall, is big sized person, and ah." I asked if the strikes were unnecessary and she said, "Yes".
After receiving medical records for it was confirmed that he suffers from . On 11-10-21, went to the ER. urinalysis showed he tested positive for amphetamines and cannabinoids on this day. He had several tests and x-rays done. He had a sprained ankle and a fracture to his left zygomatic arch (left eye area).

As a result of this investigation, I believe a finding of **SUSTAINED** is warranted due to the following policies being violated.


Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office Policies:

TCSO Policy 201.2 Authority, Ranking Officers

The ranking officer shall exercise the authority of his/her position under all conditions which require that he/she use such authority in the best interests of the Department.

Ranking officers have the authority to enforce policy and give orders to Department members inside or outside their chain of command. Authority outside the chain of command should be exercised only in circumstances which, by their nature, require immediate action and in the absence of a ranking officer in that chain of command. Ranking officers acting outside their chain of command should not vary from established policy unless:

- c. There is agreement from the affected supervisor or
- d. Emergency conditions necessitate the deviation.



TCSO Policy 340.3.1 Ethics

Sgt. arrived in the intake area after had been standing on the half wall. He did not ask any questions about nor did he research any information about He ordered the deputies to remove from the half wall and place him into the Safety Cell 3. There was no real plan on how the deputies were going to execute the order. Additionally, during the interview with Sgt. he could not make a determination on whether the use of force was necessary. He stated it was "gray".
Corporal was OIC on the day came in. There was a comment made by Deputy about going to AHS for 5150 W&I. Cpl. did not ask any questions of Deputy During the interview, she stated, "Like I said, I think he was acting erratic, but I don't specifically, I don't ask the patrol deputies specific details. It's not my job. I just make sure he's good in custody." Cpl. had a difficult time articulating on whether the use of force was reasonable or not.
Deputy was a FTO on the day he and a new hire, Deputy contacted they were aware had mental health issues according to the incident details. Deputy did not ask any questions of and his mental health status nor did he have Deputy ask. Additionally, minimal information was passed to the jail OIC, Cpl.
Deputy Green was part of a 6-deputy team to remove from the half wall of Sobering Cell 4. 





I responded to SC4 to assist. was attempting to speak with inmate was refusing to get down. told us that we were going to have to come in the cell and make him get down. then stood up on top of the wall. Sgt. ordered that be moved to Safety Cell 3(SC3) for his own safety.
and Deputy Green entered SC4 first. immediately jumped off the half wall and attempted to grab face. and Green tackled to the ground. and I attempted to gain control of legs. kicked Green in the face. refused to listen to any of our commands and was extremely combative. Green struck in the face approximately three times with a right close fist. I was able to gain control of legs. Deputy placed leg restraints on and double locked them. 

Under Rule 9 of the County of Tuolumne ("County") Personnel Rules and Regulations and Article 16 of the Memorandum of Understanding between the County of Tuolumne and the Tuolumne County Deputy Sheriffs' Association ("DSA MOU"), I am proposing to give you a letter of reprimand to remain in your personnel file for 5 years and require you to take a California POST certified Assertive Supervision course within one year of the date of this letter. If my recommendation remains unchanged following completion of any pre-disciplinary review in this matter, your discipline will be effective on the above date of this letter.

AUTHORITIES UPON WHICH MY RECOMMENDATION IS BASED

I am recommending your discipline based on your violation of the following rules, regulations, orders, and policies. A violation of any one of the sections below is sufficient to support a letter of reprimand and the decision need not be based on a finding that you violated each policy set forth below.

A. CAUSES FOR PROPOSED DISCIPLINARY ACTION

The Department has completed an internal affairs investigation into the following allegations made against you:

Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office Policies:

TCSO Policy 201.2 Authority, Rankin Officers

The ranking officer shall exercise the authority of his/her position under all conditions which require that he/she use such authority in the best interests of the Department.

Ranking officers have the authority to enforce policy and give orders to Department members inside or outside their chain of command. Authority outside the chain of command should be exercised only in circumstances which, by their nature, require immediate action and in the absence of a ranking officer in that chain of command. Ranking officers acting outside their chain of command should not vary from established policy unless:

- a. There is agreement from the affected supervisor or
- b. Emergency conditions necessitate the deviation.

TCSO Policy 340.3.6 Efficiency

- (a) Neglect of duty.
- (b) Unsatisfactory work performance including, but not limited to, failure, incompetence, inefficiency or delay in performing and/or carrying out proper orders, work assignments or the instructions of supervisors without a reasonable and bona fide excuse.



THE CELL EXTRACTION ON NOVEMBER 9, 2020
On November 9, 2020, at approximately 8:24 a.m., was "talking crazy" and was in the back room of where he works. It also told the Department that where was working and was arrested on a misdemeanor warrant for violating Penal Code section 148(a)(1) – resisting, delaying, or obstructing justice.
was transported to the jail where he was booked, cleared by the nursing staff, and placed into Sobering Cell 4. You were present for the booking process of At approximately 10:40 a.m., sat on the half wall in Cell 4. He was told by jail deputies to get off the wall, but quickly returned to sitting on the wall. then stood on top of the wall with his shirt off and began spinning his shirt in the air and motioning to the deputies.
Acting Jail Commander had several deputies gather outside the cell. The six deputies entered Cell 4 to extract so he could be placed in Safety Cell 3. jumped off the half wall. You were present during the cell extraction of During the extraction, Deputy Green delivered a combination of seven punches and "hammer" punches to the left side of face over a roughly 12-second period. Due to the punches, sustained a black and blue left eye and a fracture to his left zygomatic arch.
THE PSD INVESTIGATION OF THE CELL EXTRACTION
Review of surveillance videos of the jail and cell extraction
A review of the surveillance footage indicates that at approximately 10:54 a.m., was sitting on the half wall in Cell 4. Deputy opens the door to Cell 4 and appears to tell gets down from the wall. Deputy shuts the door and gets down from the wall. At about 10:55 a.m., gets back on the half wall and then stands on the wall waving his shirt around with his right hand. Shortly thereafter, Deputies Green, and gets down enter Cell 4 to remove and take him to Safety Cell 3.
As the deputies enter Cell 4, jumps off the wall towards Green and the other deputies. is knocked onto his back with Green and the other deputies struggling with him and attempting to restrain him. While attempting to restrain almost on top of him on his left side near his head. The surveillance video of the cell extraction shows Green punching in his face near his left eye approximately seven times with a closed fist during a roughly 12-second period. was then

subdued, placed into handcuffs and leg shackles, and placed in Safety Cell 3. suffered a black and blue left eye, a sprained ankle, and a fracture to his left zygomatic arch, which required to receive medical treatment at an emergency room.
Interviews of jail deputies and staff
Nurse was interviewed regarding her involvement in evaluating after the cell extraction. She stated that he had a "huge black eye." also indicated that she was informed that Deputy Green had been kicked in the head by nothing indicated he had been injured. When asked her professional opinion regarding injuries, stated that it appeared that he had been hit "pretty hard in the eye" and that the bone around eye was probably broken. A fracture to the left zygomatic arch was confirmed by further medical evaluation.
Deputies who either saw the incident or watched the video were also interviewed as part of the Investigation. Most of the Deputies interviewed indicated that seven strikes was excessive force due to the number of deputies used to restrain and the totality of the circumstances. For example, Deputy stated that based on his training and experience, he believed a couple punches could have "maybe" been justified, but "6-7 were a little, little much." Deputy said that he would not have used the same amount of force in restraining
Deputy also indicated that Deputy Green's use of force was unreasonable due to the number of deputies involved. He said "So, I have been in that position before, and it has not occurred to me to strike someone like that." Deputy then said, "In my opinion I probably would not have done that."
Deputy stated he was "a little surprised" by Deputy Green's actions during the extraction. Deputy acknowledged that distracting blows can be necessary, but he did not believe they were necessary in this situation. Deputy indicated that one or two strikes might have been justified depending on the level of combativeness. However, when asked if four strikes were warranted in restraining Deputy stated that four strikes and above would be too much force.
Deputies and also indicated that the strikes were not necessary in this situation. Corporal who is a defensive tactics instructor, was also interviewed as part of the IA Investigation. She stated that based on her training and experience, some strikes to might have been justified. However, based on the circumstances and the number of Deputies restraining the amount of strikes Deputy Green made to face was not warranted.

Your interview as part of the IA Investigation

The PSD interviewed you on December 10, 2020. Prior to your interview, you received a *Miranda* warning, a *Lybarger* admonition, and you were ordered to tell the truth. During this interview, you stated that you have been with the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office for 3 years and been a Corporal for one year. You have been to Supervisors school and Field Training Officer School. You have specialized training in Cell Extractions, training in Defensive Tactics and are a department instructor in Defensive Tactics.

On 11-09-2020, at about 0924 hours, Tuolumne County Patrol Deputies brought to the Tuolumne County Jail located at 175 Yaney Ave, Sonora, on a misdemeanor warrant for 148(a)(1) PC, (resisting, delaying or obstructing justice). You were present during the intake process. While in the basement, you observed being noncompliant. was loud and not answering questions. was moving and shifting around a lot. You were aware had told the nurse his ankle was hurting.
You were told by Deputy that he was going to put on a 5150 W&I hold but he decided to take him to jail instead. He told you that behavior had been "erratic." You were asked by the PSD if you tried to get any additional information from the deputies that brought in You stated that you didn't ask the Deputies for additional information concerning the status of incoming inmates by saying, "I don't ask the patrol deputies specific details. It's not my job. I just make sure he's good in custody."
was cleared by the nurse for custody. You stated that was placed in Sobering Cell 4 "due to his behavior and him being passively resisting." You also stated that, "Sobering Cell 4 is used for intoxicated persons, possibly a harm to oneself, or just to separate inmates".
At about 1055 hours, Acting Jail Commander and place him in a safety cell for his safety. You responded to the intake area where there were 6 other Deputies lined up in front of cell #4. The Deputies entered the cell and jumped off the wall towards deputy ended up on his back while the deputies were trying to restrain him. You admitted to being present when the Deputies went into the cell to remove and witnessing the incident. You left at some point to get leg shackles and never saw Deputy Green strike You later saw on video Deputy Green strike in the face several times. You heard Acting Jail Commander tell Deputy Green to stop hitting on two separate occasions. was placed into handcuffs and leg shackles. was carried to Safety Cell #3 where he was left. sustained a black and blue left eye and a fracture to his left Zygomatic Arch.



You stated you were familiar with the concept of use of force, being up to date with California's new changes to Use of Force and TCSO's Use of Force Policy 300. You stated you understood the concept of "totality of the circumstance" and were given viable examples in which you stated that you understood. You stated you received specialized training in becoming an instructor of Defensive Tactics and teaching classes to other Deputies.


You said that you understood what de-escalation tactics are and that it is covered in TCSO policy 300 Use of Force. You stated that you have received specialized training in cell extractions and that you have participated in several cell extractions.

You stated that when you run a cell extraction that you "make a plan". When asked in your interview, with all of your training and experience in use of force, if excessive force was used by Jail Deputy Green, you were either unable to make that deamination or unwilling to.

ANALYSIS

In Skelly v. State Personnel Board (1975) 15 Cal.3d 194, the California Supreme Court stated that the "overriding consideration" when addressing whether a public employer has imposed an appropriate level of discipline is "the extent to which the employee's conduct resulted in, or if repeated, is likely to result in, 'harm to the public service.'" (*Id.* at 218.) "Other relevant factors include the circumstances surrounding the misconduct and the likelihood of its recurrence." (*Id.*)

Your conduct in this case unquestionably harms the public service and your actions violated the policies identified above under Section I. The evidence supports the conclusion that your lack of supervisory control over the intake booking process of contributed to the excessive force incident and the injuries sustained.



NOTICE OF PRE-DISCIPLINARY RIGHTS

Pursuant to *Skelly* and Article 16, Section (F) of the DSA MOU, you have the right to appeal this action to Sheriff Bill J. Pooley, either verbally or in writing within seven (7) calendar days after service of this notice. Although the pre-disciplinary conference is not designed to be a formal evidentiary hearing, you may be represented by legal counsel or another individual of your choice. Your failure to provide a written response or to request a pre-disciplinary conference will constitute a waiver of your right to provide a response. Accordingly, the Sheriff's decision to either sustain, modify, or reject this recommendation will be based upon a review of this Notice of Intent and its attachments.

In arriving at this preliminary determination, I have reviewed and considered your entire personnel file. Although your file is not attached to this Notice of Intent, you may contact the Assistant to the Sheriff to schedule an appointment for you and/or your representative to examine or copy your Personnel File during business hours.

WARNING AGAINST RETALIATION

This provision is to notify you it is illegal and inappropriate to retaliate against any person who has participated in complaining or providing information regarding the allegations against you as set forth above and in the attached Internal Affairs Investigation.

I am recommending your termination based on your violation of the following rules, regulations, orders, and policies. THE PSD INVESTIGATION OF THE CELL EXTRACTION
Review of surveillance videos of the jail and cell extraction
A review of the surveillance footage indicates that at approximately 10:54 a.m., was sitting on the half wall in Cell 4. Deputy opens the door to Cell 4 and appears to tell to get down from the wall. Deputy shuts the door and gets down from the wall. At about 10:55 a.m., gets back on the half wall and then stands on the wall waving his shirt around with his right hand. Shortly thereafter, you, Deputies and and take him to Safety Cell 3.
As you and the other deputies enter Cell 4, jumps off the wall towards you and the other deputies. is knocked onto his back with you and the other deputies struggling with him and attempting to restrain him. While attempting to restrain you were almost on top of him on his left side near his head. The surveillance video of the cell extraction shows you punching in his face near his left eye approximately seven times with a closed fist during a roughly 12-second period. was then subdued, placed into handcuffs and leg shackles, and placed in Safety Cell 3. Suffered a black and blue left eye, a sprained ankle, and a fracture to his left zygomatic arch, which required to receive medical treatment at an emergency room.
Review of the incident reports regarding cell extraction
Your incident report states that when jumped off the half wall towards Deputy "deflected" towards you. Your report indicated that as you and Deputy were moving to gain control of delivered a "push kick" with his left leg that hit you in the left side of your face. You then indicate that you landed on top of and tried to gain control of his left arm. You reported delivering "seven strikes to the left side of head to gain compliance." In your report, you stated that you evaluated between each set of two strikes to his head.
Sergeant report indicated that it appeared to him that foot hit you as he fell back and that was actively resisting being restrained. In notes that he observed you hit three times in a row and that he ordered you to stop striking then writes in his report that you then struck two more times. again ordered you to stop striking and you stopped.

Interviews of jail deputies and staff

Nurse was interviewed regarding her involvement in evaluating after the cell extraction. She stated that he had a "huge black eye." also indicated that she was informed you had been kicked in the head by but nothing indicated you had been injured. When asked her professional opinion regarding injuries, stated that it appeared that he had been hit "pretty hard in the eye" and that the bone around eye was probably broken. A fracture to the left zygomatic arch was confirmed by further medical evaluation.
Deputies who either saw the incident or watched the video were also interviewed as part of the Investigation. Most of the Deputies interviewed indicated that seven strikes was excessive force due to the number of deputies used to restrain and the totality of the circumstances. For example, Deputy stated that based on his training and experience, he believed a couple punches could have "maybe" been justified, but "6-7 were a little, little much." Deputy said that he would not have used the same amount of force in restraining
Deputy also indicated that your use of force was unreasonable due to the number of deputies involved. He said "So, I have been in that position before, and it has not occurred to me to strike someone like that." Deputy then said, "In my opinion I probably would not have done that."
Deputy stated he was "a little surprised" by your actions during the extraction. Deputy acknowledged that distracting blows can be necessary, but he did not believe they were necessary in this situation. Deputy indicated that one or two strikes might have been justified depending on the level of combativeness. However, when asked if four strikes were warranted in restraining Deputy stated that four strikes and above would be too much force.
Deputies and also indicated that the strikes were not necessary in this situation. Corporal who is a defensive tactics instructor, was also interviewed as part of the IA Investigation. She stated that based on her training and experience, some strikes to might have been justified. However, based on the circumstances and the number of Deputies restraining the amount of strikes you made to face was not warranted.

Your interview as part of the IA Investigation


The PSD interviewed you on December 10, 2020. Prior to your interview, you received a *Miranda* warning, a *Lybarger* admonition, and you were ordered to tell the truth. During this interview, you admitted you are familiar with the concept of use of force, California law regarding the use of force by law enforcement officers, and the Department's Use of Force Policy. You also acknowledged your specialized training in use of force, arrest and control, impact weapons training, and defensive tactics, which included "hundreds and thousands" of control holds, escapes from chokes, punches, kicks, hostage situations, and weapon takeaways. In addition, you acknowledged your specialized training as an

instructor of defensive tactics, de-escalation tactics, and the use of impact weapons. Finally, you acknowledged that you have received specialized training in cell extractions and have participated in several cell extractions as well. With respect to the extraction itself, you acknowledged that you entered the cell to extract with the assistance of five other deputies. You admitted to striking in the same area of the face with a closed fist seven times and that a fist can be considered an impact weapon. You also acknowledged that strikes to the face may be deadly or cause great bodily injury. Finally, you admitted that never punched or grabbed you during the cell extraction. REVIEW OF YOUR PERSONNEL FILE On October 18, 2018, when you held the rank of Corporal, you brought inmate into the jail library after learning he referred to you as a "bitch ass" in an outgoing message from the jail. There were no other deputies present with you and in the library. You engaged with unprofessional and confrontational demeanor, which directly contributed to escalating into a state of agitation. Your actions did not reflect your level of training and experience during the contact. Your demeanor and actions created an environment that was confrontational in nature, in direct violation of your training and experience. Your actions created an unnecessarily volatile situation evidencing poor judgment. At the end of the conversation, you initiated the use of physical force in an attempt to place into handcuffs and re-house resisted, and you used force to overcome his resistance. On February 19, 2019, as a result of this incident, you were demoted from Corporal to Deputy. You have specialized training in the following areas: 8 hours in Cell Extractions, 46 hours in Arrest and Control, 40 hours as a Field Training Officer, 96 hours as an Impact Weapons instructor, and 80 hours as a Defensive Tactics instructor. In each of these courses you were taught a component on the use of force to include reasonable force and de-escalation techniques. **ANALYSIS** In Skelly v. State Personnel Board (1975) 15 Cal.3d 194, the California Supreme Court stated that the "overriding consideration" when addressing whether a public employer has imposed an appropriate level of discipline is "the extent to which the employee's conduct resulted in, or if repeated, is likely to result in, 'harm to the public service.'" (Id. at 218.) "Other relevant factors include the circumstances surrounding the misconduct and the likelihood of its recurrence." (Id.) Your conduct in this case unquestionably harms the public service and reveals that you are unfit to serve as a Deputy in this Department. Your actions violated the policies identified above under Section I.

November 9, 2020, was excessive and unwarranted. The IA Investigation revealed that

you were the only deputy to strike Not only did you strike



Your conduct during the cell extraction was especially concerning because of your training and expertise in defensive tactics, de-escalation techniques, and your status as an

instructor in teaching the appropriate methods for using force when interacting with violent or potentially violent members of the public. Based on the totality of the circumstances, it is my conclusion that you used excessive force gaining the compliance of the cell extraction.

Your behavior brought mistrust and discredit to the Department. It also disrupted the efficiency of the Department. These actions violated Tuolumne County Sheriff's Policy, County Rules and Regulations, and the Deputy Sheriff's Association MOU.

Your conduct during this incident and the incident leading to your demotion documented above, demonstrates your unwillingness to conform to department rules, policies and orders. Those requirements exist for the safety of the public and personnel, as well as ensure the Department's operations do not violate the rights of citizens.

Your conduct also severely compromised your credibility as a Jail Deputy Sheriff in the eyes of your co-workers, the public, and this Department. The Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office cannot tolerate or condone the behavior you have demonstrated toward inmates. Your conduct has exposed the Sheriff's Office to potential liability for the injuries sustained by The Department cannot continue to employ you when you have engaged in such egregious and irresponsible action. It leaves the Department with little choice other than to propose termination of your employment. For these reasons, I am proposing to terminate your employment as a Tuolumne County Jail Deputy Sheriff

NOTICE OF PRE-DISCIPLINARY RIGHTS



ANALYSIS

In Skelly v. State Personnel Board (1975) 15 Cal.3d 194, the California Supreme Court stated that the "overriding consideration" when addressing whether a public employer has imposed an appropriate level of discipline is "the extent to which the employee's conduct resulted in, or if repeated, is likely to result in, 'harm to the public service.'" (Id. at 218.) "Other relevant factors include the circumstances surrounding the misconduct and the likelihood of its recurrence." (Id.)

Your conduct in this case unquestionably harms the public service and your actions violated the policies identified above under Section I. The evidence supports the conclusion that your lack of supervisory control over the situation contributed to the excessive force incident and the injuries sustained.

Your failure to ask deputies who were present during the intake process and gather information about the status of mental health, physical health, his actions while in our custody led to poor decision making. The information potentially gathered may have altered your quick decision to use force to remove which led to the excessive force and severe injuries to Your failure to spend more time attempting to de-escalate the situation before ordering the cell extraction also contributed to the outcome. Your failure to organize the responding deputies, make a plan on how the response would take place and to brief them on all of the available information that was available to you contributed to the excessive force used in this incident and the injuries sustained.

Peace officers must uphold the highest standards of conduct. (See Ackerman v. State Personnel Board (1983) 145 Cal. App.3d 395, 400.) I expect all of the Department's deputies to follow the Department's policy regarding use of force. This particular incident is especially concerning because an inmate was seriously injured.

Your conduct leading up to the cell extraction and your lack of definitive answers in your interview were especially concerning because of your training and experience as a supervisor, and your status as the Acting Jail Commander.

Taking into consideration that you viewed the incident and then watched it several more times on video afterwards, you had enough information to make an opinion and answer the question of "Did Deputy Green use excessive force on ______ The expectation of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office is for it's supervisors and command staff to be able to take all of the available information they have at the time of the interview and give an opinion based on their training and experience. All of the Jail Deputy Sheriff's interviewed in this case were able to give an opinion when asked if they thought Deputy Green used excessive force.

Deputy Marcus Green:
As noted in the May 4, 2021 Notice of Proposed Disciplinary action, the Sheriff's Office has completed an internal affairs investigation into the following allegations made against you:

On November 9, 2020, Acting Jail Commander Sergeant called Undersheriff Evans to report that he had just witnessed a "questionable" use of force incident during a cell extraction. Undersheriff Evans directed Sergeant to report the incident to the Professional Standards Division ("PSD"). On November 10, 2020, Sergeant brought the incident reports and video footage of the cell extraction to PSD. An Internal Affairs ("IA") Investigation was opened into the use of force during the cell extraction.

Upon review of the investigation, Undersheriff Neil Evans proposed the following disciplinary action in the May 4, 2021 Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action:

1. You were to be terminated from your employment as a Jail Deputy Sheriff with the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Department ("Department").

In accordance with Office policy, the Memorandum of Understanding between the Tuolumne County Deputy Sheriff's Association and the County of Tuolumne, and as provided in the Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action, you requested a "Skelly" predisciplinary conference to respond to this proposed disciplinary action. On June 17, 2021, I met with you and your representative Jason Jasmine for that purpose.

After careful consideration of all the information presented by you and your representative at the Skelly pre-disciplinary conference and upon further review of all the information relied upon and previously provided to you as part of the Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action, I am willing to modify your proposed disciplinary action as follows. Instead of termination, you are being suspended for 160 working hours which shall be served between October 1, 2021 and February 28, 2022 in the following manner. You shall take one unpaid workweek (Sunday through Saturday) per month.

A. CAUSES FOR FINAL DISCIPLINARY ACTION

This disciplinary action is being taken based upon the following SUSTAINED violations:

Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office Policies:

TCSO Policy 300.3 Use of Force

Deputies shall use only that amount of force that reasonably appears necessary given the facts and circumstances perceived by the deputy at the time of the event to accomplish a legitimate law enforcement purpose. (Penal Code \S 835a)

The reasonableness of force will be judged from the perspective of a reasonable deputy on the scene at the time of the incident. Any evaluation of reasonableness must allow for the fact that deputies are often forced to make split-second decisions about the amount of force that reasonably appears necessary in a particular situation, with limited information and in circumstances that are tense, uncertain and rapidly evolving.

TCSO Policy 340.3.6 Efficiency

(b) Unsatisfactory work performance including, but not limited to, failure, incompetence, inefficiency or delay in performing and/or carrying out proper orders, work assignments or the instructions of supervisors without a reasonable and bona fide excuse.

TCSO Policy 340.3.7 Performance

(i) Any act on- or off-duty that brings discredit to this office.

TCSO Policy 340.3.8 Conduct

- (b) Unreasonable and unwarranted force to a person encountered or a person under arrest.
- (c) Exceeding lawful peace officer powers by unreasonable, unlawful or excessive conduct.
- (f) Discourteous, disrespectful or discriminatory treatment of any member of the public or any member of this office or the county.

(m) Any other on- or off-duty conduct which any member knows or reasonably should know is unbecoming a member of this office, is contrary to good order, efficiency or morale, or tends to reflect unfavorably upon this office or its members.

B. ACTS OR OMISSIONS LEADING TO THE FINAL DISCIPLINARY ACTION

The above policy violations are based on your sustained commissions of the following conduct as identified during the internal affairs investigation of the underlying allegations (Internal Affairs Investigation #19-002). A copy of the investigation report has previously been provided to you as part of the Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action.

Please note that any of these acts alone, constitute a sufficient basis to impose the disciplinary action.

A summary of the internal affairs investigation findings are as follows.

FACTS SUPPORTING THE CHARGES

The following is a summary of the facts supporting my recommendation to terminate your employment.

THE COMPLAINT OF EXCESSIVE FORCE

On November 9, 2020, Acting Jail Commander Sergeant called Undersheriff Evans to report that he had just witnessed a "questionable" use of force incident during a cell extraction. Undersheriff Evans directed Sergeant to report the incident to the Professional Standards Division ("PSD"). On November 10, 2020, Sergeant brought the incident reports and video footage of the cell extraction to PSD. An Internal Affairs ("IA") Investigation was opened into the use of force during the cell extraction.



was transported to the jail where he was booked, cleared by the nursing staff, and placed into Sobering Cell 4. At approximately 10:40 a.m., sat on the half wall in Cell 4. He was told by jail deputies to get off the wall, but quickly returned to sitting on the wall. then stood on top of the wall with his shirt off and began spinning his shirt in the air and motioning to the deputies. You and several other deputies gathered outside the cell. You and five other deputies entered Cell 4 to extract so he could be placed in Safety Cell 3. jumped off the half wall. During the extraction, you delivered a combination of seven punches and "hammer" punches to the			
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THE PSD INVESTIGATION OF THE CELL EXTRACTION

Review of surveillance videos of the jail and cell extraction

A review of the surveillance footage indicates that at approximately 10:54 a.m., was sitting on the half wall in Cell 4. Deputy opens the door to Cell 4 and appears to tell to get down from the wall. Deputy shuts the door and gets down from the wall. At about 10:55 a.m., gets back on the half wall and then stands on the wall waving his shirt around with his right hand. Shortly thereafter, you, Deputies and take him to Safety Cell 3.
As you and the other deputies enter Cell 4, jumps off the wall towards you and the other deputies. is knocked onto his back with you and the other deputies struggling with him and attempting to restrain him. While attempting to restrain you were almost on top of him on his left side near his head. The surveillance video of the cell extraction shows you punching in his face near his left eye approximately seven times with a closed fist during a roughly 12-second period. Was then subdued, placed into handcuffs and leg shackles, and placed in Safety Cell 3. Suffered a black and blue left eye, a sprained ankle, and a fracture to his left zygomatic arch, which required to receive medical treatment at an emergency room.
Review of the incident reports regarding cell extraction
Your incident report states that when jumped off the half wall towards Deputy deflected" towards you. Your report indicated that as you and Deputy were moving to gain control of delivered a "push kick" with his left leg that hit you in the left side of your face. You then indicate that you landed on top of and tried to gain control of his left arm. You reported delivering "seven strikes to the left side of head to gain compliance." In your report, you stated that you evaluated between each set of two strikes to his head.
Sergeant report indicated that it appeared to him that foot hit you as he fell back and that was actively resisting being restrained. notes that he observed you hit three times in a row and that he ordered you to stop striking then writes in his report that you then struck again ordered you to stop striking and you stopped.
Interviews of jail deputies and staff
Nurse was interviewed regarding her involvement in evaluating after the cell extraction. She stated that he had a "huge black eye." also indicated that she was informed you had been kicked in the head by but nothing indicated you had been injured. When asked her professional opinion regarding injuries, stated that it appeared that he had been hit "pretty hard in



deadly or cause great bodily injury. Finally, you admitted that never punched or grabbed you during the cell extraction. REVIEW OF YOUR PERSONNEL FILE On October 18, 2018, when you held the rank of Corporal, you brought inmate into the jail library after learning he referred to you as a "bitch ass" in an outgoing message from the jail. There were no other deputies present with you and in the library. You engaged with unprofessional and confrontational demeanor, which directly contributed to escalating into a state of agitation. Your actions did not reflect your level of training and experience during the contact. Your demeanor and actions created an environment that was confrontational in nature, in direct violation of your training and experience. Your actions created an unnecessarily volatile situation evidencing poor judgment. At the end of the conversation, you initiated the use of physical force in an attempt to place into handcuffs and re-house resisted, and you used force to overcome his resistance. On February 19, 2019, as a result of this incident, you were released from probation as a Corporal.. You have specialized training in the following areas: 8 hours in Cell Extractions, 46 hours in Arrest and Control, 40 hours as a Field Training Officer, 96 hours as an Impact Weapons instructor, and 80 hours as a Defensive Tactics instructor. In each of these courses you were taught a component on the use of force to include reasonable force and de-escalation techniques. CONCLUSION In Skelly v. State Personnel Board (1975) 15 Cal.3d 194, the California Supreme Court stated that the "overriding consideration" when addressing whether a public employer has imposed an appropriate level of discipline is "the extent to which the employee's conduct resulted in, or if repeated, is likely to result in, 'harm to the public service.'" (Id. at 218.) "Other relevant factors include the circumstances surrounding the misconduct and the likelihood of its recurrence." (Id.) Your actions violated the policies identified above under Section I. The evidence supports the conclusion that your use of force against November 9, 2020, was excessive and unwarranted. The IA Investigation revealed that you were the only deputy to strike Not only did you strike times with a closed fist, you delivered those punches all within a roughly 12-second period to the same part of his face. While you claimed in your report that you evaluated between each set of two punches, the video demonstrates that you punched

to his eye and a fractured left zygomatic arch. While you claim that you were disoriented

and unable to see because of push kick that landed on your face, Nurse



the incident and assured me that noting like this would happen again. You have a solid work history and in keeping line with progressive discipline, I have reduced your termination to a 160 hour suspension.
