

Subject: Notice of Investigation/ Confidentiality Order

Let this serve as a notice that you are the subject of an Internal Affairs Investigation regarding your conduct as an employee of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office. You are under investigation and are subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination. Due to the possibility of disciplinary action you are hereby notified of your right to representation. Effective immediately, you are assigned to paid administrative leave pending the conclusion of this investigation and all subsequent proceedings. Paid administrative leave is subject to the guidance of *TCSO Policy 1020.8 Administrative Leave*.

The investigation has been assigned to (Lt. Jarrod Pippin), should you have any issues or questions you may contact the investigator at (209-694-2970). The date, time and location of your interview will be determined at a later time and may be adjusted by your representation based on their availability.

It has been brought to the attention of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office that your actions may be in violation of County Policy and/ or the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office Policy and Procedures.

#### TCSO Policy 320 Domestic Violence

The purpose of this policy is to provide the guidelines necessary to deter, prevent and reduce domestic violence through vigorous enforcement and to address domestic violence as a serious crime against society. The policy specifically addresses the commitment of this office to take enforcement action when appropriate, to provide assistance to victims and to guide deputies in the investigation of domestic violence.

## TCSO Policy 340 Standards of Conduct

This policy establishes standards of conduct that are consistent with the values and mission of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office and are expected of all office members. A formal complaint was made regarding your alleged involvement and conduct in a criminal investigation and neglect of your duties as a Deputy Sheriff.

A complaint alleges on 7/17/19, at 1950 hours, the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office
received a report of a domestic disturbance involving a and
During the subsequent response a criminal investigation was conducted by you
resulting in being arrested for numerous penal code violations, including
felony domestic violence, and transported to the Tuolumne County Jail for booking. The
complaint alleges as a deputy sheriff you developed a personal relationship with
and orchestrated her release without charges for the crimes she committed and
transported her back to her residence disregarding the victims' rights and call for help.
The complaint further alleges as a deputy sheriff you continued to communicate with
in an inappropriate and personal nature following the incident.

It is alleged that numerous violations of governing policies and statutes were committed by you during the criminal investigation, which went against enforcement of the law to protect the victim and to facilitate the victims' and offenders' access to appropriate civil remedies and community resources. The alleged unsatisfactory work performance occurred while you were acting as a deputy sheriff, responsible for ensuring investigations are done in a manner consistent with department policies, and California law while keeping the best interests of the department.

This is a confidential investigation. You are ordered not to discuss any aspect of this investigation with any other county employee, volunteer, contractor, or witness to the incident, with the exception of your designated employee representative, or the designated investigator.

You will not access any Sheriff's Office records, reports or databases for materials that relates in any way to this investigation. All previous orders or directives are still in effect. As a result of your administrative leave status, you are not allowed to access, or attempt to access any public safety buildings, offices in the official capacity of a peace officer until this investigation is concluded. However, you still maintain the same rights to information and records as any law-abiding citizen. Failure to abide by this confidentiality order may result in disciplinary action up to and including termination.



Sir,

I have completed the investigation into alleged misconduct of David Danel, generated from a formal complaint and additionally an internally generated complaint. This investigation also covers the supervision of David Danel by Sergeant both during and after the investigation that led to the complaint of misconduct. The formal complaint of alleged misconduct involving David Danel was filed with the Sheriff's Office on or about July 21<sup>st</sup>, 2019, by David Danel resigned from his position as a Deputy Sheriff prior to the completion of this investigation.

#### **SYNOPSIS:**

On July 17 <sup>th</sup> , 2019, contacted dispatch and reported his wife
"blew up", was throwing property off their porch and breaking things in their
home. David Danel responded to in and
subsequently arrested for felony domestic violence. Deputy Danel
transported to the jail for booking, and later brought her back to her
residence without completing the booking process. When
how she got out of jail, she told him "I sucked his dick, how the fuck do you
think I got out". later found phone records showing numerous text messages and
phone calls between and David Danel, at all hours of the day and night.



## SUMMARY OF CONDUCT:

I conducted a review of the domestic violence case involving and and and are and a review of the complaint filed by including any outcome of investigation into the complaint. This administrative review resulted in additional investigation into the allegations of misconduct of David Danel and the conduct of staff during the domestic violence investigation.

Based on my review of the domestic violence investigation conducted by David Danel, and my review of the formal complaint filed by alleging misconduct from David Danel, it is alleged David Danel violated sections of the following TCSO, Tuolumne County Policy and DSA MOU governing sections:

## **Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office Policies:**

The purpose of this policy is to provide the guidelines necessary to deter, prevent and reduce domestic violence through vigorous enforcement and to address domestic violence as a serious crime against society. 

# Summary of TCSO Case #19-2442, reports authored by David Danel

David Danel's original case report was written over a period spanning between July 17<sup>th</sup> and July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019 and outlines the investigation he conducted into the domestic violence incident involving and On July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2019 the report was viewed and approved by Sergeant A copy of the report is attached to this administrative report. Upon my review of the report I noticed several actions that were, based solely on the report, in violation of department policy. There were also several investigative tasks not mentioned in the report, required by department policy. The following is a summary of the report.

The report indicates was arrested at the scene for a felony violation of domestic violence and transported to the Tuolumne County Jail for booking. Prior to booking, David Danel was able to obtain a statement from and she stated broke her foot. David Danel asked a jail nurse to look at foot, however there were no photographs taken of the injury as required by policy (320.4 (e)). The report indicated would not allow David Danel to take any photographs of her foot.



## Summary of MDC/GPS records from David Danel


During my investigation I met with Lt. David Vasquez and requested to view portions of David Danel's in car GPS audit. Lt. Vasquez showed me numerous GPS tracks where David Danel was frequenting the area of the residence while on duty. Some of these instances were during shifts when David Danel was assigned to work the Groveland beat. There were also numerous GPS tracks that showed David Danel turn off his MDC/GPS when he arrived in the Tuolumne City area, and then activate his MDC/GPS when he was leaving the area of Tuolumne City. None of the GPS tracks that I viewed were associated with calls for service in the area or associated with activity logged in RIMS. The GPS tracks I viewed were after the complaint was filed by

## Interview with (9/24/19)

On September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2019 at approx. 1254 hours I called and spoke with regarding the complaint he filed with our office. I asked if he was ever contacted by a supervisor with a resolution to the complaint. He stated, "I did not receive a call back, I don't know the outcome of whether the Deputy is dating my wife or not, but I know my marriage isn't very good".


I asked to summarize what he reported in the complaint. He stated, "my wife attacked me, and I called you guys for help, you guys arrested her for domestic violence and ended up dropping the charges, brought her home, and then for the next couple of days my wife and the deputy were texting back and forth all times of the day and night".


further stated "I asked you guys for help I didn't need someone to stand in as a husband. I thought it was inappropriate for him to be texting my wife after midnight because he works nightshift".




## Interview with (10/3/19)

On October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2019 at 1300 hours I met with at her home in Tuolumne. Present with me was Lt. David Vasquez. I told the reason I was there was an administrative investigation involving alleged misconduct from one of our deputy sheriffs. The misconduct was related to the domestic violence incident involving her and told me she was aware of the complaint her husband had filed. About the complaint, told me asked her how she got out of jail the morning following her arrest. told "I sucked his dick, how the fuck you think I got out", referring to the deputy who took her to jail. I advised additionally, complained there was inappropriate communication via texting and phone calls between her and the deputy. told me she communicated with David Danel, via text and phone calls. had never been through an incident like this and she was trying to get information about what happened, such as why originally called and what would happen next. the conversation was strictly professional and David Danel gave her some information through text messages which she has since erased. I asked if her phone records would show the messages sent or received from her phone and she acknowledged they would. our criminal report indicated she received an injury to her foot. I asked her if anyone took photographs of the injury to her foot the night of the incident. did not remember any photographs being taken of her foot, and said she was intoxicated so her memory of everything that night isn't the greatest. The only photographs remembered being taken were of her tattoos while in the jail. has not seen a doctor at any time since the incident for the injury to her foot. said there was no reason to see a doctor because her foot was broken and there is nothing that could be done for the injury.







Lieutenant Vasquez advised how serious the allegations in the report are, and if the allegations are true they need to be processed by the law. He stated it was highly interesting that she was arrested for felony domestic violence and not booked into jail, and in fact she was brought back home while intoxicated where the victim was located. He stated we could already prove David Danel did several things wrong, we were not trying to say it had anything to do with her, but we were trying to understand why. responded by asking "do you think it was because of a professional courtesy?" She further stated, "because I know if I picked up one of you guys I would go out of my way, I would do everything I could". Lt Vasquez asked if there was a conversation about professional courtesy that took place between her and David Danel. responded by saying "Yes".

David Danel took her away from the house so both she and could sober up. stated, "I believe he was trying to remove me from the situation, so it did not get any more out of control". Lt. Vasquez told it sounded like this was not something she was assuming, rather it sounded like a discussion they had. stated, "he did tell me it was a professional courtesy." said she was seeing her career going down the tubes over something her "piece of shit" husband had done and she voiced this concern to David Danel.


When pressed for dates and times of her contacts with David Danel, became nervous and could not remember any specifics. She continually stressed that her relationship with David Danel was strictly professional, and at no time did anything inappropriate happen. I asked no less than 6 times if she was willing to provide her phone records or her phone, to show the extent of her contacts with David Danel and she refused. I ended my conversation with and advised her she could call me if she changed her mind and wanted to provide her phone records.


## Interview with (10/4/19)

On October 4<sup>th</sup>, 2019 I contacted via telephone to conduct a follow up interview. It was obvious while speaking with he was intoxicated. He repeatedly told me he did not want to get anyone in trouble. I told there was further information that came to light, including him being labeled as the suspect of spousal rape in the report. stated, "yes if you have sex with your wife and she doesn't want to it's rape". kept repeating himself, saying he was part of the public safety family, and did not want to get anyone into trouble. I advised I would re-contact him the following Monday when he was sober.

## Interview with (10/7/19)


On October 7<sup>th</sup> at 1000 hours I met with at Starbucks in the junction shopping center. Present with me was Tuolumne County Sheriff's Lieutenant I began by clarifying I was conducting an administrative investigation into the complaint he filed with the Sheriff's Office, not a criminal investigation. I asked to go over the nature of the complaint he filed. He confirmed the complaint was regarding text messages and phone calls that his wife was receiving from David Danel. did not remember the exact date and times of the calls because he no longer has access to phone records. He sent the call log that he had to the Sergeant who handled the complaint (he did not remember the Sergeant's name) from his personal email address, (I later had IT supervisor conduct a search for the email on the server and he was unable to find any record of this email being sent) I asked to check his email account and confirm that he no longer has the call log in his email sent/outbox. He checked and did not have it. told me he typically erases his emails because he gets so many and it clogs up his email account.





David Danel was the arresting officer in his case and a few things have come to light since his arrest about David Danel that left him feeling uneasy. Approx. 6-7 months ago phone and came across a text chain between he was going through his David Danel and his ex-wife. His son's phone used to belong to his ex-wife. did not know why the texts were still on the phone, possibly because his ex-wife gave it to their son without wiping it. said the texts were "personal" in nature. He described the texts to be inquisitive, with David Danel asking questions like "how have you been" and "is everything ok". As he was reading the texts he assumed they were from a friend of his ex-wife, however when he scrolled to the beginning of the text thread it started with a text along the lines of "hello this is Deputy Danel" who was asking how his ex-wife has been. He remembered there being texts stating things like "I am here for you if you need me" and other messages he felt were strange. wasn't sure if it was normal for deputies to reach out to persons involved with cases with questions like he saw. He described the messages as being appropriate if a friend had sent them to her, but not for a deputy. did not save the messages or take photos of them and he no longer has access to his ex-wife's phone records. He did not know if the messages were still on his sons' phone now, but his son still has the phone. I asked if he examined his sons' phone again and the messages were still present I would like to see them. did not know if his ex-wife would be cooperative if I spoke with her, stating she often lies. He also stated his ex-wife has made comments to him that she did not want the case to move forward and he feels like there is outside influence on part of the deputy and the attorneys. via telephone and was unable to I later made several attempts to contact to contact me and she did not return my call. I reach her. I left a message for the messages he saw on his son's phone had since later confirmed with been deleted.




During my administrative investigation, I made a request with Lieutenant David Vasquez for follow up investigation into the domestic violence incident between and as well into the allegations of spousal rape made by The request resulted in investigative follow up being assigned to Detective's and

On October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019 I was advised by Detective a search warrant was obtained to seize electronic devices from David Danel and determination was made to place David Danel on administrative leave pending the outcome of both the administrative and criminal investigation. At approx. 1800 hours I contacted David Danel at the patrol office and requested he meet with me at the Sheriff's Administration building.

I drove to the Sheriff's Administration building and I met with David Danel, Sergeant (Deputy Sheriff's Association Representative) and Lt. David Vasquez. I read David Danel the notice of investigation and confidentiality order, which included being placed on administrative leave effective immediately. David Danel signed the order, a copy of which is attached to this report. Lt. David Vasquez notified David Danel of the search warrant for electronic devices and asked him to turn over any cell phones or devices in his possession.

David Danel immediately handed Lieutenant Vasquez a cell phone from his pocket and stated it was his personal phone. Danel advised he was recently issued a department cell phone which was in his patrol car. He stated he did not own or possess any other phones. I walked with Lt. Vasquez and David Danel to his patrol car and he retrieved the department issued phone and handed it to Lt. Vasquez. David Danel was then provided a ride to his residence by Sergeant who retained David Danel's firearm, badge and department identification.







After was interviewed on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of October, she had a conversation with David Danel about what to say during any administrative interviews. She was going to state their relationship was strictly professional and after speaking occasionally, they became friends. They also discussed getting new phone numbers, and purchased David Danel a cell phone used to communicate with her. She remembered purchasing the phone around David Danel's birthday, in response to Danel's wife contacting and confronting her about her relationship with David. The last time had contact with David Danel was the day prior to this interview, when they met and had sex.


## Interview with Sergeant (10/22/19)


On October 22nd, 2019 at 1500 hours, I spoke with Sergeant of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office in the presence of his legal representation, Jason Jasmine. Also present during this interview was Lieutenant David Vasquez, Professional Standards Division Commander for the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office. I recorded our conversation. I explained to Sergeant the nature of my investigation and read the admonishments verbatim to him. Sergeant signed and initialed the appropriate portions. The following is a summary of the interview with Sergeant


In Sergeant successfully completed the basic post academy at the Ray Simon Criminal Justice Training Center. While in the academy a learning domain on domestic violence was covered which Sergeant successfully completed/passed. Sergeant was hired by the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office and successfully completed the field training program, part of which contains a block of instruction and training on domestic violence. During his career, which spans roughly 19 years, he has handled no less than 50 domestic violence investigations which he classifies as a "common call". Sergeant is currently assigned to patrol as a Sergeant and as one of the field training unit supervisors.


























# Dispatcher

On October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2019 I met with Dispatcher at the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office administration building. I advised Dispatcher the reason for our meeting was to discuss the internally generated complaint regarding alleged misconduct involving David Danel. I had Dispatcher sign a confidentiality order and then asked her numerous questions regarding the complaint along with her observations of David Danel. The following is a summary of our conversation.










I asked Dispatcher if she was aware of any negative reputations surrounding David Danel. Dispatcher told me she was aware of several incidents involving David Danel, one of which was an incident where he was with Sergeant while on duty and involved in an automobile accident. She was also aware of an incident where David Danel's posted a rant on Facebook claiming he was having an affair.


#### FINAL SUMMARY:

On July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019, former Deputy Sheriff David Danel was charged with the duties of working as a patrol deputy. Sergeant was charged with the duties of the watch commander and was directly supervising David Danel. Both were assigned to the graveyard watch, between the hours of 1800 and 0600.










Per TCSO dispatch records, David Danel cleared the jail at 2144 hours and gave a case disposition of an arrest being made. This was after he completed the booking process. He was summoned back to the jail to transport to AHS for medical clearance at the request of the jail nurse and arrived at 2249 hours. All the information David Danel obtained from relative to the domestic violence incident (statements) came prior to him coming back to transport her for medical clearance.


It is evident David Danel omitted information from his report to avoid the appearance of releasing from custody as a professional courtesy, and rather give the appearance of him making his decision based on information he developed during his interview with prior to, and during booking. David Danel already had all relevant information when he made the decision to book and close out the call with an arrest made. It is evident his decision to release from custody was not based on lack of probable cause, rather the potential embarrassment she would face by being seen at the hospital, and by her admission as a professional courtesy.




Sergeants are tasked with reviewing and approving reports prepared by deputies to ensure they are factually accurate, contain the required documentation to support charges, and to ensure department policies and procedures have been followed. Sergeant demonstrated unsatisfactory work performance when he failed to recognize the inconsistencies and misrepresentation of facts in the report authored by David Danel.

On July 19<sup>th</sup> contacted David Danel and asked him to come over for coffee, to which David Danel agreed. This contact was documented in a supplemental report, however David Danel omitted the location of the meeting and he classified the meeting as "follow up". David Danel documented observing bruising on and documented statements she made alleging she was the victim of spousal rape. Indicated was the person who raped her.

There is nothing in the supplemental report, or evidence, indicating photographs were ever taken of the injuries. There were no requests or anything to indicate investigative follow up was being done in relation to the rape allegations. David Danel added additional charges of 262(A)(3)PC to the report and changed the status to "information only". At no time did David Danel conduct, or request, further investigation into the allegations of spousal rape and domestic violence.



David Danel omitted information from his investigative reports and disobeyed direct orders from his supervisor. When asked specific questions during this investigation, David Danel was not truthful in his response. David Danel made efforts to hinder the investigation, which was confirmed in an interview with when she said David Danel coached her on what to say should she be questioned in an administrative investigation.



Sergeant supervision of David Danel during the investigation into alleged domestic violence between and accompanied by his decision to allow the release of from custody and approve related reports, was not consistent with department policies and procedures, nor was it consistent with the professionalism and sound judgment required of a watch commander with the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office. His failure to supervise and/or recognize inappropriate behavior from David Danel while investigating the complaint from and actions while doing so, was in direct violation of numerous governing policies of the Sheriff's Office, the DSA MOU and the County of Tuolumne rules and regulations.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

As a result of this investigation, I believe a finding of SUSTAINED is warranted for the following alleged TCSO policy, DSA MOU and Tuolumne County policy violations pertaining the actions of former Deputy Sheriff **David Danel**:

### **Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office Policies:**

#### Policy 320.4 Domestic Violence, Investigations

- (e) All injuries should be photographed, regardless of severity, taking care to preserve the victim's personal privacy. Where practicable, photographs should be taken by a person of the same sex. Victims whose injuries are not visible at the time of the incident should be asked to contact the general investigations in the event that the injures later become visible.
- (j) Deputies should take appropriate enforcement action when there is probable cause to believe an offense has occurred. Factors that should not be used as sole justification for declining to take enforcement action include:
- 4. The potential financial or child custody consequences of arrest
- 5. The physical or emotional state of either party
- 6. The use of drugs or alcohol by either party
- 7. Denial that the abuse occurred where evidence suggests otherwise.
- 11. The racial, cultural, social, professional position or sexual orientation of the victim or suspect

# Policy 320.5 Domestic violence, victim assistance

Victims may be traumatized or confused. Deputies should:

- (b) Provide the victim with the Office's domestic violence information handout, even if the incident may not ride to the level of a crime
- (c) Alert the victim to any available victim advocates, shelters and community resources

# Policy 320.9.1 Domestic violence, standards for arrests

Deputies investigating a domestic violence report should consider the following:

(a) An arrest should be made when there is probable cause to believe that a felony or misdemeanor domestic violence offense has been committed (penal code 13701). Any decision not to arrest an adult when there is probable cause to do so requires supervisor approval.

# Policy 320.9.4 Domestic violence, reports and records

(b) Reporting deputies should provide the victim with the case number of the report. The case number may be placed in the space provided on the domestic violence victim information handout provided to the victim. If the case number is not immediately available, an explanation should be given regarding how the victim can obtain the information at a later time.

### Policy 340.3.1 Standards of Conduct, Ethics

- (a) Using or disclosing one's status as a member of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office in any way that could reasonably be perceived as an attempt to gain influence or authority for non-office business or activity
- (b) The wrongful or unlawful exercise of authority on the part of any member for malicious purpose, personal gain, willful deceit or any other improper purpose
- (g) Any other failure to abide by the standards of ethical conduct

#### Policy 340.3.3 Standards of conduct, relationships

(a) Unwelcome solicitation of a personal or sexual relationship while on-duty or through the use of one's official capacity.

- (b) Engaging in on-duty sexual activity including, but not limited to, sexual intercourse, excessive displays of public affection or other sexual contact
- (c) Establishing or maintaining an inappropriate personal or financial relationship, as a result of an investigation, with a known victim, witness, suspect or defendant while a case is being investigated or prosecuted, or as a direct result of any official contact

### Policy 340.3.6 Standards of conduct, efficiency

- (a) Neglect of duty
- (b) Unsatisfactory work performance including, but not limited to, failure, incompetence, inefficiency or delay in performing and/or carrying out proper orders, work assignments or the instructions of supervisors without a reasonable or bona fide excuse
- (c) Concealing, or attempting to conceal, removing or destroying defective or incompetent work

# Policy 340.3.7 Standards of conduct, performance

- (a) Failure to disclose or misrepresenting material facts, or making any false or misleading statement on any application, examination form, or other official document, report or form, or during the course of any work-related investigation
- (b) The falsification of any work-related records, making misleading entries or statements with the intent to deceive or the willful and unauthorized removal, alteration, destruction and/or mutilation of any office record, public record, book, paper or document.
- (c) Failure to participate in, or giving false or misleading statements, or misrepresenting or omitting material information to a supervisor or other person in a position of authority, in connection with any investigation or in the reporting of any office-related business.

(d) Being untruthful or knowingly making false, misleading or malicious statements that are reasonably calculated to harm the reputation, authority or official standing of this office or its members.

### Policy 340.3.8 Standards of conduct, conduct

(h) Criminal, dishonest, or disgraceful conduct, whether on or off-duty, that adversely affects the member's relationship with this office

(m) Any other on or off-duty conduct which any member knows or reasonably should know is unbecoming a member of this office, is contrary to good order, efficiency or morale, or tends to reflect unfavorably upon this office or its members

### Policy 804.6 Records Section, arrest without filing of accusatory pleading

The patrol division commander should ensure a process is in place for when an individual is arrested and released, and no accusatory pleading is filed so that the following occurs (penal code section 849.5 & 851.6)

(a) The individual is issued a certificate describing the action as a detention.

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I checked in the master bedroom. On the nightstand (same nightstand where the firearm was located) closest to the door that led outside, I located a Samsung smartwatch. I know through my training and experience that devices such as these (i.e. Smart watches) have cellular-like capabilities and can be used like cellular phones. Some are also capable of storing messages (i.e. Short Message Service "SMS" and Multi-media Messaging Service "MMS") and other data. This watch was photographed by CSO per my request and later seized as evidence.

There was a large entertainment center located across from the bed in the master bedroom. I opened the cabinet-style swinging doors and noticed there were some drawers. I opened the top drawer and I located three other cellular phones. Two of these phones were Samsung brand devices and the other was a Motorola. These were also photographed by CSO at my request and later seized as evidence.

I went into the closet of the master bedroom. To my immediate left there was a shelf with some clothing and other items. On the same shelf, I noticed a stripper clip with approximately 10 live rounds of 7.62x39 ammunition. I recognized these rounds and the configuration they were in (attached in a straight line with a stripper clip) as the same type of ammunition that would be used in an SKS or AK-47 style rifle. There were also two other firearms (pistols) on the shelf.

On the floor directly underneath the shelf with the stripper clip and pistols, I noticed several other ammunition cans and boxes of ammo which were labeled 7.62x39 and .223 or 5.56 caliber.

Directly above me on the top shelf, I noticed several rifle cases. I used a chair to stand on and looked inside the rifle cases. In the first one, I noticed a complete assembled, AR-style rifle. I noticed that the rifle had a collapsible stock and a vertical foregrip on the fore end. There was no bullet button and that the weapon did not appear to be California compliant or legal. There were also detachable magazines in the rifle case. The writing on the side of the rifle indicated that it was chambered in 7.62x39 caliber.

In the case directly below that one was another similar AR-style rifle (complete assembled). This rifle had the same configurations (i.e. collapsible stock, vertical fore end grip, detachable magazines and no bullet button). The writing on the side of this rifle indicated that it was chambered in .223 or 5.56 caliber.

On the top shelf, just to the left of the two AR style rifles, I located an SKS semi-automatic rifle. This rifle was also modified so that it could accept a detachable magazine and it had a bayonet affixed to the front of it. It should be noted this SKS rifle was also chambered in 7.62x39 caliber.

I left these items in place and notified Detective what I had located. I advised him that I believed these weapons were not legal within California and fell under Penal Code Section 30605 (a) which is an illegal assault weapon. CSO later photographed these rifles per my request.

Based on the rifles being located inside the house during the course and execution of our search

The message after that is again from and states, "Well my husband told me he was speaking with your husband, so this is why I am asking. I guess I can ask your husband directly since you want to be a bitch about it." The next response from on the text thread was at 2215 hours. It states, "If that's what you want to do, do it. Why do you want to bring me into your stuff. I haven't talked to your husband for months now. He's a dick. I had to ask him some questions and he gave me answers. I don't want anything to do with him."
There was another screen shot of a text conversation between and This one is dated October 11 at 1050 hours. The first message is from asking, "Show me the phone record that your husband received a call from mine". The responds with, "I can, but why? Your husband has the same records and the same questions about the need to talk at 2:00 a.m. etc." The next message is at 1053 hours. It states, "No, I want to see the phone record where your husband got a call from my husband's phone. You're trying to start something with me and I want you to prove it. Yes, he has the records for July. Does he have any other months? No, because I haven't contacted your husband and he hasn't tried to contact me."
There is another screen shot that appears to contain a picture of a phone bill. It's dated 9/27. This was sent again from phone; however, I'm unable to read the information in the photo due to it being too pixelated and grainy. There's a message directly underneath the photo from which states, "I have July and August so it was not just July." responds with, "Well, that wasn't me. I was at work, so".
There is another screen shot which appears to be a continuance of the previous message. It states from "You're right it stopped in August when I confronted both of you about it, otherwise we all know it would have not stopped. It only stopped because you were caught, but then I have the newest call in September." responds with, "I wasn't caught doing anything." responded to this message with, "The point is it continues longer than it should have and it did not stop until I confronted both of you." responded with three emojis (same emoji three times in a row) of a smiley face that is laughing so hard it is crying.
I observed another conversation that was a screen shot on Schrader's phone. It appeared to be correspondence with Deputy Dave Danel. Deputy Danel starts the conversation by stating, "How are you really doing." The next message is again from Deputy Danel saying, "Yes, your neighborhood is my beat for the month." He then tells her that he works Thursday, Friday and Saturday. responds back by stating, "Well, he's not coming back any time soon so you shouldn't have to respond here tonight." Deputy Danel responds back by stating, "Oh good, I'll just wait for an invite then. LOL. Can't take you to jail twice now can I? HAHA Sorry." responds to this by stating, "Not too bad. I could be worse and still in jail". Her next message is again states, "That would be a really bad day. That's what I thought this morning. I was like are you fucking kidding me now what did I do." Deputy Danel responds to this by stating, "Well, I know that. But when those things happen you have to tell us everything. We are restricted in what we can do with domestic violence. Our hands get tied."
There's another screen shotted message thread labeled, "David D." There's a date associated with this of October 10 at 1557 hours. writes to Danel, "Once you have trust you have everything."



Um, there were some procedural things that were not done within our policies, um, in relation to the incident that took place here. Okay? Um, because of that, that case is still an open investigation, and we have to relook at that, we have to talk to you. Uh, part of that is looking at cellphone records. A judge signed a warrant for your residence, okay? And that's what we're here for today, okay? So um, I don't want ya to freak out, all right, um, but that's just what has to happen. Okay? Um, I'm, my goal is to find the truth, um, that's what I do. I, I'm not here to make accusations or, you know, say that you're guilty of anything. Um, I wasn't here that night, I wasn't one of the officers that responded to the scene, um, but since then there's been a lotta things that are going on, and um, this is one of the steps that we have to take as investigators. That's why we have a avarrant for electronic devices. The devices that we collect here today, we're gonna write search avarrants for those. Okay? And they may show things that would relate to whatever relationship was taking place. My, my issue is not so much whatever inappropriate relationship you may or not have had with him, or appropriate relationship, I don't know, but it's more, uh, the ccusations of you were arrested, you were then released the same night. Those can, those types of accusations are, fall under things like conspiracy, um, to commit a crime, to conceal evidence, hings like that. Okay? And those are the allegations that we are investigating. We're nevestigating the domestic violence incident, what happened after the jail when you got here as are as the criminal side of those things. There is an internal affairs investigation going on with Deputy Dannell right now. That's why the lieutenants were speaking with you, okay? So you ave to understand, um, these allegations are very serious. I'm not saying you did anythin
Our job is to also prove something didn't happen to you, so we'll get the acts of that too. We're the factfinders. It's not just innocence or guilty, it's to prove that if omething did happen, okay, we investigate that, or if something didn't happen, well then, here's, there's evidence to show that nothing happened here that was inappropriate. We just ave to know that.
Okay, so like if I go down there, we're only talking about the domestic iolence case. Is that correct?





I checked in the master bedroom. On the nightstand (same nightstand where the firearm was located) closest to the door that led outside, I located a Samsung smartwatch. I know through my training and experience that devices such as these (i.e. Smart watches) have cellular-like capabilities and can be used like cellular phones. Some are also capable of storing messages (i.e. Short Message Service "SMS" and Multi-media Messaging Service "MMS") and other data. This watch was photographed by per my request and later seized as evidence.

There was a large entertainment center located across from the bed in the master bedroom. I opened the cabinet-style swinging doors and noticed there were some drawers. I opened the top drawer and I located three other cellular phones. Two of these phones were Samsung brand devices and the other was a Motorola. These were also photographed by CSO at at my request and later seized as evidence.

I went into the closet of the master bedroom. To my immediate left there was a shelf with some clothing and other items. On the same shelf, I noticed a stripper clip with approximately 10 live rounds of 7.62x39 ammunition. I recognized these rounds and the configuration they were in (attached in a straight line with a stripper clip) as the same type of ammunition that would be used in an SKS or AK-47 style rifle. There were also two other firearms (pistols) on the shelf.

On the floor directly underneath the shelf with the stripper clip and pistols, I noticed several other ammunition cans and boxes of ammo which were labeled 7.62x39 and .223 or 5.56 caliber.

Directly above me on the top shelf, I noticed several rifle cases. I used a chair to stand on and looked inside the rifle cases. In the first one, I noticed a complete assembled, AR-style rifle. I noticed that the rifle had a collapsible stock and a vertical foregrip on the fore end. There was no bullet button and that the weapon did not appear to be California compliant or legal. There were also detachable magazines in the rifle case. The writing on the side of the rifle indicated that it was chambered in 7.62x39 caliber.

In the case directly below that one was another similar AR-style rifle (complete assembled). This rifle had the same configurations (i.e. collapsible stock, vertical fore end grip, detachable magazines and no bullet button). The writing on the side of this rifle indicated that it was chambered in .223 or 5.56 caliber.

On the top shelf, just to the left of the two AR style rifles, I located an SKS semi-automatic rifle. This rifle was also modified so that it could accept a detachable magazine and it had a bayonet affixed to the front of it. It should be noted this SKS rifle was also chambered in 7.62x39 caliber.

I left these items in place and notified Detective what I had located. I advised him that I believed these weapons were not legal within California and fell under Penal Code Section 30605 (a) which is an illegal assault weapon. CSO later photographed these rifles per my request.

Based on the rifles being located inside the house during the course and execution of our search

A property receipt was filled out and provided to on scene. agreed to speak about our initial investigation, but opted to not speak about the subject of the with Detective firearms we had located in her house. At one point during our contact with her, she did make a statement about claiming ownership of at least one of the rifles and said she had built one of them.

We later returned to the Sheriff's Office and put the firearms and electronic phone devices that we had seized during the warrant into a temporary evidence locker.

On 10/22/2019 at approximately 1035 hours, I removed the firearms and phones from the temporary locker.

The SKS rifle (entered into RIMS as item #1 in the property section) was a Norinco brand SKS rifle. The serial number on the rifle was 21001961.

The second rifle (entered into RIMS as item #2 in the property section) was an Anderson Manufacturing AM-15, multi-caliber rifle. It was chambered in .223 or 5.56 Nato and had a serial number of 16321826. Inside the case with this rifle, I located a 30-round polymer magazine, which was also designed to take .223 or 5.56 ammunition. I removed this magazine and packaged it separately.

The third rifle (entered into RIMS as item #3 in the property section) was also an Anderson Manufacturing AM-15, multi-caliber rifle. The serial number was 18045135 and was chambered in 7.62x39 caliber.

I had Dispatch run these firearms in CLETS and in the Automated Firearms System (AFS). Dispatch advised me that none of these firearms were on file in CLETS or (AFS) and there was no registered owner associated or listed with the firearms. These weapons were all rendered safe and packaged.

I then packaged the phones and smart watch that were seized. I booked the items into evidence Locker No. 21.

You are hereby notified that the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office would have Terminated you from the position of Deputy Sheriff if you had not resigned prior to the completion of this investigation. This action would have been taken based upon the following violations:

### **Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office Policies:**

### Policy 320.4 Domestic Violence, Investigations

- (e) All injuries should be photographed, regardless of severity, taking care to preserve the victim's personal privacy. Where practicable, photographs should be taken by a person of the same sex. Victims whose injuries are not visible at the time of the incident should be asked to contact the general investigations in the event that the injures later become visible.
- (j) Deputies should take appropriate enforcement action when there is probable cause to believe an offense has occurred. Factors that should not be used as sole justification for declining to take enforcement action include:
- 4. The potential financial or child custody consequences of arrest
- 5. The physical or emotional state of either party
- 6. The use of drugs or alcohol by either party
- 7. Denial that the abuse occurred where evidence suggests otherwise.

11. The racial, cultural, social, professional position or sexual orientation of the victim or suspect

### Policy 320.5 Domestic violence, victim assistance

Victims may be traumatized or confused. Deputies should:

- (b) Provide the victim with the Office's domestic violence information handout, even if the incident may not ride to the level of a crime
- (c) Alert the victim to any available victim advocates, shelters and community resources

### Policy 320.9.1 Domestic violence, standards for arrests

Deputies investigating a domestic violence report should consider the following:

(a) An arrest should be made when there is probable cause to believe that a felony or misdemeanor domestic violence offense has been committed (penal code 13701). Any decision not to arrest an adult when there is probable cause to do so requires supervisor approval.

### Policy 320.9.4 Domestic violence, reports and records

(b) Reporting deputies should provide the victim with the case number of the report. The case number may be placed in the space provided on the domestic violence victim information handout provided to the victim. If the case number is not immediately available, an explanation should be given regarding how the victim can obtain the information at a later time.




The particular facts of this recommendation were identified during the internal affairs investigation (Internal Affairs Investigation #19-004). These findings were sustained, and a recommendation was made by the Disciplinary Review Board that met on 01/31/2020. A summary of the internal affairs investigation findings are as follows.


You had been employed with the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office for approximately 2 years as a Deputy Sheriff. You were a San Diego City Police Officer for approximately 4 years prior to coming to the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office. In 2013 you successfully completed the basic POST academy. While in the academy, a learning domain on domestic violence was covered which you successfully completed/passed. You successfully completed the two field training programs, part of which contains a block of instruction and training on domestic violence.



On July 17<sup>th</sup>, 2019, you were charged with the duties of working as a patrol deputy. You were assigned to the graveyard watch, between the hours of 1800 and 0600.

At approximately 1950 hours you were dispatched to a domestic disturbance at the residence of and you arrived on scene at 2005 hours. During an investigation at the scene, you





courtesy". Several procedures and required forms were ignored or never mentioned in your report, such as documentation of injuries (photographs) and written documentation supporting s release from custody. You also cited 847(c) PC, which does not exist, as a governing section which would to be released from custody. allow On July 19<sup>th</sup> contacted you and asked you to come over for coffee, to which you agreed. This contact was documented in a supplemental report; however, you omitted the location of the meeting and you classified the meeting as "follow up". You documented observing bruising on and documented statements she made alleging she was the victim of spousal rape. indicated was the person who raped her. There is nothing in the supplemental report, or evidence, indicating photographs were ever taken of the injuries. There were no requests, or anything to indicate investigative follow up was being done in relation to the rape allegations. You added additional charges of 262(A)(3) PC to the report and changed the status to "information only". At no time did you conduct, or request, further investigation into the allegations of spousal rape and domestic violence. On or around July 21<sup>st</sup>, 2019, contacted the Sheriff's Office to report an inappropriate relationship between you and his wife The complaint alleged you and were texting and calling each other at all hours of the day and night. The complaint was forwarded to Sergeant who questioned you about your contact with You admitted to communicating with via text message, however you claimed it was work related and had since erased the messages from your phone. Sergeant ordered you to cease all contact with and to forward any investigative reports to the Tuolumne County District Attorney for review. Any communications between and you should have been documented in a report and they were not. You disobeyed the orders from Sergeant never forwarding the case for review and continued to have contact with From the time you conducted your investigation, and over the days and weeks leading up to your developed an inappropriate sexual relationship. This included resignation, you and multiple incidents of on duty sexual conduct, including sexual intercourse. You went to extreme measures to conceal the relationship, including obtaining a cell phone from to conceal

embarrassment she would face by being seen at the hospital, and by her admission "as a professional

your communications and repeatedly manipulating your patrol car GPS to hide your location while on duty.

You omitted information from your investigative reports and disobeyed direct orders from your supervisor. When asked specific questions during this investigation, you were not truthful in your response. You made efforts to hinder the investigation, which was confirmed in an interview with when she said you coached her on what to say, should she be questioned in an administrative investigation.

Your investigation into alleged domestic violence that occurred between and accompanied by your decision to release from custody was not consistent with department policies and procedures, nor was it consistent with the professionalism and sound judgment required as a Deputy Sheriff with the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office. Your decision to engage in an inappropriate relationship with and actions while doing so, was in direct violation of numerous governing policies of the Sheriff's Office, the DSA MOU and the County of Tuolumne rules and regulations.

### CONCLUSION:

Based on your conduct during the events on and after 07/17/2019, described above and in the attached internal affairs report, you violated the above-referenced personnel rules and policies.

Your behavior, and lack of integrity disrupted the efficiency of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office. You willfully violated several governing sections of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Policy, County Rules and Regulations, to include the Deputy Sheriff's Association MOU. As a sworn Peace Officer, you are held to a high standard. You are entrusted by the public to display the highest level of personal conduct, morality and professional skill.

Your conduct demonstrated your unwillingness to conform to department rules, policies and orders. Those requirements exist for the safety of the public and personnel, as well as ensure the agency's operations do not violate the rights of citizens. Violation of these requirements, therefore, placed the agency and others at considerable risk and they left the agency with little choice other than to terminate your employment had you not resigned prior to the completion of this investigation.

It has been brought to the attention of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office that your actions may be in violation of County Policy and/or the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office Policy and Procedures.

### Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office Policies:

### TCSO Policy 201.2 Authority, Ranking Officers

The ranking officer shall exercise the authority of his or her position under all conditions which require that he or she use such authority in the best interests of the department.

An internal complaint alleges numerous violations of governing policies and statutes were committed by in the investigating officer during the criminal investigation, which went against enforcement of the law to protect the victim and to facilitate the victims' and offenders' access to appropriate civil remedies and community resources.  Additionally, the internal complaint alleges was injured and no medical treatment was sought for her injuries. The alleged unsatisfactory work performance occurred while you were acting as the watch commander, responsible for ensuring investigations are done in a manner consistent with department policies, and California law while keeping the best interests of the department.



### INTERVIEW WITH SERGEANT

10/22/19

Lt. Pippin: All right. We're recording. It is October the 22<sup>nd</sup>. It's about 2:50 in the afternoon. Present with Sergeant Jason Jasmine his representation and Lieutenant Vasquez of the Professional Standards Division, and, uh, we are here today to do an interview in regards to an Internal Affairs investigation. And, uh, we will go ahead and start off with the administrative admon, admonishments. Um, I'm sure you probably were briefed on these and what's, what's to be, uh, to come, what's to be expected or what's coming, so we'll just go ahead and get right through 'em real quick. Um, you have some constitutional rights, and due to the nature of this administrative investigation, Government Code § 3303, Subsection H requires me to advise you of your constitutional rights. Therefore, it is important that you understand that criminally, you have the right to remain silent. Anything you say may be used against you in court. You have the right to an attorney before and during questioning. And do you understand each of these rights that I've explained to you?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Having these rights in mind, would you like to speak to me now?

Sgt No.

Lt. Pippin: So, if I can just get you to check those there, the proper responses. All right. We'll move to the next one. While you have the right to remain silent with regard to any criminal, to any criminal investigation, you do not have the right to refuse to answer my questions administratively. This is an administrative investigation. I am, therefore, now ordering you to answer all of my questions fully and honestly. If you refuse to answer my questions, your silence can be deemed insubordination and result in administrative discipline, up to and including termination. Any statement you make under a compulsion of threat of such discipline is for administrative purposes only and cannot be used against you criminally. And then here, it says, uh, that you understand — I'll just read it verbatim — I understand my rights as described in the Lybarger admonishment and will or will not discuss this matter with you administratively. So, what you're gonna, fill out the will part.

Sgt I understand, yes.

J. Jasmine: So, you're actually skipping ahead.

Sgt Oh, sorry.

Lt. Pippin: So, on that –

Sgt Will?

Lt. Pippin: Yeah, sorry. Uh, just the will. Yes, circle that. There you go. And then the last part here is the Weingarten admonishment. You have the right to a representative present with you at this meeting. Your representation is here. You, you have the right to meet with your

representative prior, prior to being questioned, and you can request a recess at any time during this interview to speak privately with your representative. Your representative can ask clarifying questions but cannot interfere with the investigation in any manner. Your representative cannot instruct you to answer any, any of our questions. Any refusal to answer any of our questions under the direction – or excuse me – any refusal to answer any of our questions under the direction of your representative will be deemed to be insubordination, to which you can be disciplined, up to and including termination. And, again, it's, at the bottom, it's, uh, you understand your rights as described in the admonishment, and is there any reason the interview, uh, cannot continue at this time. And then the waiver, you don't need to fill that part out 'cause your representative is here.

Sgt Sign it?

Lt. Pippin: Yep.

J Jasmine: Yes. You can just cross out this line here, I waive my right to – yeah. And then you can sign and date it.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. So, you wanna witness that or?

J Jasmine: Sure.

Lt. Pippin: All right. As we get started here, there's a couple of things I brought that I just wanna provide for you, and should you need to reference either one of these at any time during the interview, that's what they're here for. One is a copy of the actual case report. That's dated from July, or the actual case report that came in July 17<sup>th</sup> in regards to and and I what is a report that was authored by Deputy Dannell and a, a report that Sergeant uh, reviewed and approved. So, there's a copy of that should you need it. What's not included in this is the supplemental reports because those were reviewed by a different sergeant, not Sergeant There's that, and then also now I probably will be getting into a little bit of the domestic violence policy, so I brought you a copy of that, as well. If you wanna, if you need to pause at any moment in time to review that stuff to get your recolle, lec, recollection back, that's what those are there for. So, feel free to ask for a pause or break when, when needed.

Sgt Okay.

Lt. Pippin: All right. Let's, uh, let's start with, uh, just kinda laying a foundation of some training of and training of, training of – I'm getting my words jumbled – training and experience, starting when in, kinda way back, um, with the police academy. What year did you go to the police academy?

Sgt 2009?

Lt. Pippin: 2009? Okay. And that was at the Modesto academy, correct, ray simon?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: While you were in the academy, did they cover domestic violence in one of the learning domains?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Um, as every academy does. It's a requirement for, for post. Um, and, uh, you successfully completed that learning domain at the academy?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Yes? Um, moving forward, you were hired here that same year. We, we sponsored you, correct?

Sgt Uh, yes. I was hired before that, uh, but yes, I was sponsored.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. So, you came right through, you went, came through our FTO program directly ag, after, uh, the academy graduation, and during the FTO program, uh, is it true that we also cover domestic violence as part of the, um, phase training in the FTO program?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. During your career, how many – just, and this is gonna be a rough guesstimate – how many domestic violence cases do you think you've handled?

Sgt I have no idea. A lot.

Lt. Pippin: A lot?

Sgt Couldn't put a number to it.

Lt. Pippin: Uh, would you say more than 50?

Sgt Yes. It's a, it's a common call.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Um, currently, you are the, uh, sergeant assigned to patrol, correct?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Um, and you're also the field training unit supervisor?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Can you explain to me as a patrol sergeant, um, what your duties as the watch commander are?

Sgt Yes. Uh, it's to supervise my crew, uh, ensure they're not violating policy, violating the law, uh, violating any type of, uh, county rule, uh, that they're enforcing the law. Okay. Wanna go back, um, this would've been now probably close to at least, Lt. Pippin: what was it, at least a few weeks ago. Could've been more, more like a month ago. Um, I learned about a complaint, uh, from a uh, alleging that Deputy Dannell had, um, established a personal, personal relationship with his then wife, or current wife, um, and, more specifically, that the complaint alleged that he was having an inappropriate relationship via text with her. Um, believe the specifics of that complaint were that it was at all throughout, all hours of the night and they were texting inappropriate things, uh, between each other. And then I contacted you about that complaint because I was curious about what the resolution was. Do you, do you recall that conversation? Sgt Yes. Okay. Um, during that conversation, I asked you to document the findings on a Lt. Pippin: complaint form, which you did. Um, um, do you recall the summary of those findings that, uh, you provided to me? Sgt Yes. Lt. Pippin: Okay. Um, and I apologize, I don't have the actual summary with me, but during that, um – well, lemme ask you this. Everything in that summary that you provided me is, was, in fact, true and correct. Sgt Yes. Uh, to the best, best of my recollection, yes. Lt. Pippin: And understanding that it, it had taken place probably a month, month and a half prior to you, you and I speaking. Yes. Sgt had said that he provided you with a call log, uh, Lt. Pippin: Right. Um, between his wife, and Deputy Dannell. Did you receive that call log from him? Yes. Sgt Lt. Pippin: Do you know how you got that call log, or do you recall how, how you received it? I gave him my email address, and he sent to me. Sgt

An email to you? Okay. Do you still have it?

I don't believe I do.

Lt. Pippin:

Sgt

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Lemme go through some of these real quick just to make sure I've got everything. Have you ever been led to believe, at any point in time, that Deputy Dannell's integrity has been called into question, um, or have you ever been given any reason not to trust him?

J Jasmine: Timeframe? Ever, up through the present day?

Lt. Pippin: Since his, since he's been, uh, assigned to your, to your, to your shift – or, or lemme, lemme strike that – since he's been assigned to patrol.

J Jasmine: But, again, just to be clarified, through the present day because –

Lt. Pippin: No. Until you took the complaint.

J Jasmine: Okay.

Sgt No.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. So, in that summary that you provided me is something I, I wanna confirm before we move forward. Um, in the summary, it specified that you, uh, had advised that you gave an instruction to Deputy Dannell to not have any more contact with unless he went through you and got authorization to have contact with her. Is that, in fact, uh, accurate?

Sgt That is accurate.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. In the, in the complaint summary that you wrote, it says that you, you told that to that you had that contact with Deputy Dannell, but it does not specify what you said to Deputy Dannell in, in that context. So, can you tell me what your exact words were to Deputy Dannell, to the best of your recollection?

Sgt To, uh, exact words, no. The best of my recollection, um, I told him that, um, he was to have no further contact with her, um, and he was to document what he had found in his follow up and that that follow up would then be, uh, forwarded to, uh, well, he would make a determination whether, uh, it, there was a criminal complaint, and that would go to the DA, or if there needed to be further investigation, and that would go to investigations.

Lt. Pippin: Okay.

Sgt That he was to have no further involvement in any investigation regarding them at all.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. And at that point, did you, were you aware of the follow up that he had conducted? 'Cause, uh, I understand, well, it, it's documented in the report that there was a little bit of follow up done by Deputy Dannell, and you were aware of that follow up at that time.

I was aware he was doing follow up. Sgt Lt. Pippin: Okay. I'm not, I was not, at that time, aware of what that follow up was, uh, entirely, no. Sgt Okay. And did Deputy Dannell acknowledge your orders to cease contact with Lt. Pippin: He said he would never speak or text with her again. Sgt And did you expect that those orders would be followed and obeyed? Lt. Pippin: Sgt Absolutely. I wanna walk through a little bit of the investigation, um, understanding that you Lt. Pippin: were present when the investigation took place. Sgt Yes. Jarrod, can I, can I make one comment real quick? Just for – Lt. Vasquez: Lt. Pippin: Absoluetly. Lt. Vasquez: - clarity, we talked about, um, a previous complaint or an initial complaint that that you received, correct? was made from Yes. Sgt Lt. Vasquez: Okay. And during that time, um, you looked at the call log and the information that he provided to you, and at that time, did you determine that there was violations that had taken place? Based on that initial, based on the information that gave to you, the circumstance that you had there on that day, did you determine that there was policy violations? No. I determined that it was concerning, and I was gonna follow up with it. Sgt But it was unfounded at that point? Lt. Vasquez: At that point, yes -Sgt Lt Vasquez: Okay. mm hmm. - uh, even according to Mr., uh, Sgt Lt. Vasquez: Okay. So, the complaint then came in, it was unfounded based on the initial information that you received, and you carried on after that.

Sgt	Yes.
Lt. Vasquez:	Giving Deputy Dannell the guidance of you're not to contact her, correct?
Sgt	Yes.
Lt. Vasquez:	Okay.
Lt. Pippin: Uh, during our conversation at that time in my office, as well, um, you began to discuss the case with me a little bit. Not in great detail, but understanding that the complaint came from that investigation, you began to kind of explain to me the narrative of what happened that day. I didn't really have the opportunity to ask you any questions at that time. However, you did advise me of a few things then, and I just wanna clarify and, again, based on your re, your re, recollection of the investigation, and if you need to refer to the report at any time, please do so. Um, did you have, did you have contact with at the scene the day of the initial response at the reshi, re, residence for that domestic violence call?	
Sgt	Yes.
Lt. Pippin:	Okay. Did you observe her level of intoxication that night?
Sgt	Uh, yes, I'm the one that found her.
Lt. Pippin: Okay. And, uh, I understand that, and I don't know if you know this, but I understand she blew a .21 while she was at the jail. Would that be accurate from what your observations were to her level of intoxication?	
Sgt fine.	Um, I would have no guess to her level of intoxication. She walked and talked
Lt. Pippin:	Okay.
Sgt	Uh, uh, but it was obvious she had been drinking.
Lt. Pippin:	Did, uh, did appear injured based on what you recall?
Sgt	No. She walked and, and talked fine, slight, slight slur like she had been drinking.
Lt. Pippin: Okay. Um, uh, after, there was a determination made at the scene that Deputy Dannell was going to arrest her for domestic violence, and according to the report, that was based on an injury to He had a scratch on his arm he documented with a photograph and through his narrative and because the alterta, altercation that took place between them established relationship and so on. Um, once at the jail, there was a determination made by Deputy Dannell that she was gonna be released from custody. Did Deputy Dannell request permission from you to release her from custody?	

No. He did not request permission. Uh, he was at the jail. Uh, then I heard him go out over the air that he would be providing her a, a ride back to her house, and I got ahold of him. I don't recall if it was over the air saying gimme a 10-21 or if I grabbed my phone and called him. I don't re, recall, but I spoke with him, um, and, and I said hey, while I respect your, your judgment and I kinda have to, uh, these are the kind of things I need to know about. What is going on? Um, and then he explained to me that, uh, she had given a statement at the jail, and based on the statement, uh, not only did he not have probable cause to arrest her, but he did not know that domestic violence had, he was no longer positive domestic violence had even occurred based on the totality of statement and her statement. They both, uh, alleged that yes, there was an argument and that there was an, uh, inadvertent, or possibly inadvertent scratch. They did not know if it was intentional, um, and she complained of, of, uh, foot pain, and she didn't know if it was intentional. So, based on his investigation, he did not believe domestic violence took place, and he no longer had probable cause to arrest her.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Excuse me. I think you, you answered kinda my next question, but this was, this was, uh, after he had taken her from the jail – I just wanna confirm that – after he had taken her from the jail, you heard him go en route back to her residence with her?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: And then you request that he contact you.

Sgt Yes. I think, I think, um, yes, yes.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. And he advised you of those facts -

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: - uh, uh, that supported his decision to do that.

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Another thing that I wanted to clarify, um, when we had our conversation in my office is that you had made, um, a statement that the reason why our office didn't pursue any contact with further contact whether, it was to seek him out as a suspect of domestic violence or to get a statement because he had left the residence. Is that —

Sgt My –

Lt. Pippin: – accurate from what you recall?

My understanding of the night of was that he was going to be leaving. Um, I was, when we arrived at the scene, I was not the investigating officer. She was alleged to have been in the house somewhere, so I was watching the house. There was a conversation going on, uh, 20, 25 yards behind me, and I could hear parts of it, and I heard him say that, uh, he was going to

be taking his kids sometime really early that morning, uh, and driving them to Arizona or Utah, wherever his ex lives, turning them over, and then he was en route to somewhere in the Bay Area, I believe, where he's a medic now, uh, that he would be gone for several weeks.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Did Deputy Dannell, uh, when he was giving you or articulating those facts that led him to the decision to take her back home, during that conversation, did he bring up the fact that was no longer gonna be at the residence, which was part of his decision to take her home or supporting that decision?

Sgt Um, I don't know if he specific, I, I can't recall if he specifically mentioned that. Um, I know it was in my thought process. Uh, so, I, I couldn't say whether he did or not.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Based on what you knew, did you make the assumption that he'd be leaving the residence?

Sgt I, I assumed he was already gone, yes.

Lt. Pippin: Okay.

Sgt Or, or would be before they arrived.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Did Deputy Dannell at any time show you any evidence that suggested that was a victim of domestic violence?

Sgt Did - no.

Lt. Pippin: No. Did you find his decision odd?

Not odd. Um, I didn't, I didn't find it odd, uh, when comparing it to have I been at the scene of, of a possible domestic violence where a, Spouse A and Spouse B have both been drinking, they get in an argument and somebody inadvertently gets hurt. Um, I didn't find that odd. I found it odd that he made the decision without consulting me and left the jail. Uh, I did find that, uh, uh, I would not have done that to one of my supervisors. If I was, if I had somebody in custody at the jail, I would've contacted a supervisor before doing that. Um, so, that was different. The decision itself odd? No.

Lt. Pippin: Maybe odd's not the best term to use. I guess it's unorthodox. It's not something that we typically do.

Sgt Correct.

Lt. Pippin: Um, and you've already answered, I think, some of this, but just to confirm again, you didn't interview yourself at any time?

Sgt No.

And, and you were the one that found her under the shed? Lt. Pippin: Sgt Yes. Did you take her into custody at that point as far as, like, detention? Lt. Pippin: No. There was a third deputy there. I called her out, and that deputy came over Sgt and handcuffed her. Okay. Did, uh, when you had your conversation with Deputy Dannell, um, on the Lt. Pippin: phone after he's leaving the jail, did he ask permission to forego having medical clearance done or having her seen for any injuries at the hospital? No. He told me that he didn't have probable cause to arrest her, um, that she was, Sgt uh, a free person, um - I don't, again, I don't recall his exact words - um, and that she worked at the hospital as a charge nurse and also as a flight nurse, and she was refusing to go, uh, as, as, you know, her own person who was no longer in custody because she was afraid that she would be embarrassed and possibly lose her job. Okay. Did he tell you that she had a broken foot? Lt. Pippin: Um, no. He said she's walking with a limp, and, uh, you know, that, that, uh, that Sgt she said her foot's hurt but she's, she's fine. She doesn't want medical attention. Okay. You answered my next question about her being a nurse and the subject of Lt. Pippin: possible embarrassment had she gone to the hospital. Um, per we've spoken to know, as part of this investigation, and per she had a, she told us that she had a conversation with Deputy Dannell about being released from custody and not being charged, and the reason that she had this conversation was because of some of those things and that they discussed doing this as a professional courtesy, quote. Um, did Deputy Dannell, uh, in your, during your conversations, ever suggest to you or make any statements as such that, uh, he was doing this for her as a professional courtesy? And I say doing this, meaning releasing her from custody. No. Um, again, by the time I was aware of it, uh, he had already made the decision to release her from custody. Um, he never told me it was being done as a professional courtesy. He told me he does not have probable cause in his mind to arrest her for domestic violence, um, and I asked him, you know, uh, or I, I explained well, even with it being dome, domestic violence, you still have to have probable cause one way or another to make an arrest. If you truly feel you don't, then that's what the 849 section is for, so. Lt. Pippin: Okay. Lt. Vasquez: Jarrod, just so I can clarify one thing, please. Lt. Pippin: Mm hmm.

Lt. Vasquez: All right.

Lt. Pippin: Absolutely.

Lt. Vasquez: Going back to that, the line of questioning before this, it was your understanding, based on a phone conversation that you had with Deputy Dannell, that he had made a decision to 849(b) her, therefore she was free from custody, and after that, she was refusing medical attention.

Sgt Correct.

Lt. Vasquez: It wasn't that she was a prisoner who was refusing medical attention.

Sgt Correct. My understanding of the conversation and the way that it was explained to me, he did not have probable cause to make an arrest, and therefore she was a free person, and we could not force medical treatment on her, and she was refusing it.

Lt. Vasquez: Okay.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. We already talked about him leaving. So, I'm gonna reference the report a little bit here in a second, but can you tell me what the purpose would be for, not just this report, but sergeant's, uh, responsibility to review a report and, uh, and approve them?

Sgt To -

Lt. Pippin: Can, can you tell, talk to me about the purpose of that and –

Sgt Sure. It's, it's –

Lt. Pippin: – what the process is?

Sgt — to ensure that it's, one, factually accurate, um, to ensure that it includes the elements of a crime, uh, to ensure that there were no intentional or unintentional policy or law violations and that we're providing the proper service to the public and that it's properly documented — excuse me — uh, and also to allow that deputy, uh, and any other deputies who may become involved in it to have a basic understanding of what occurred to follow in it, uh, to further investigation or to testify later in court.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. This report in question that we're speaking about today, did you, did you re, did you read that report thoroughly?

Sgt To the best of my recollection, yes.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. When you were reviewing that report as part of your responsibilities as the watch commander, did you compare that report against p, uh, policy, Sheriff's Office policy or the penal code when you were viewing it?

Sgt Did I physically sit there and, and pull up policies? No. Did I physically pull up the penal code? No. Um, that's generally not something that, uh – to answer your question, no, I did not. I went off of –

Lt. Pippin: And I think you were kind of going in a direction which was along with my next question. That, is that typical that you would do that?

Sgt No.

Lt. Pippin: I wanna reference the, uh, domestic violence policy real quick.

Lt. Vasquez: Can, can I look at that narrative real quick, this right here?

Lt. Pippin: Yeah. That's the supplemental. So that's, yeah, that's after the fact. I wanna bring your attention to a few things. I've got them highlighted. If you ki, if you go to Page 2. In reference to Domestic Violence Policy 320, specifically we'll start with, uh, Section 320.4 which is the guidelines for the investigations and how we, um, investigative guidelines that we follow, the Deputy should follow when investigating cases of domestic violence. Um, Subsection D talks about when practical and legally permitted, video or audio recording, all significant statements and observations. Um, I can tell you that there's no video or audio recorded statements that have been booked into evidence. Is it your recollection that none of that was done, or at least presented to you in the report?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Uh, Subsection E. "All injuries should be photographed regardless of severity, taken, taking care to preserve the victim's personal privacy. Where practicable, photographs should be taken by a person of the same sex. Victims whose injuries are not visible at the time of the incident should be asked to contact the general investigations in the event that the injuries later become visible", and I will tell you, and you can reference the report if you need to, that Deputy Dannell talks about injuries that sustained during the incident, specifically a possible broken foot, and that no photographs were taken of those injuries. Do you know of any photographs that we don't have that were taken of those injuries?

Sgt No, I do not.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Do you know, uh, and also it talks about, and this is not in, not in, for the record, not in a, in a report that you approved, um, but he does speak about injuries, visible injuries that she sustained, um, suspected to have sustained during this incident that he speaks of in a supplemental report later, and there is also no photographs attached to the report booked into evidence. Are you aware of any of those photos, photos that exist?

Sgt No.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Um, "Deputies should, should request that the victim complete and sign an authorization for release of medical records related to the incident when applicable." Do you know, again, none of that is attached to the report or booked, do you know that if filled out a release of med, for medical records?

Sgt Uh, no, it's my understanding that neither sought medical treatment, and therefore, uh, neither, uh, would have been asked to sign that.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Um, "If the suspect is no longer at the scene", this is Subsection G, uh, "deputies should make reasonable efforts to locate the suspect to further the investigation and provide the suspect with an opportunity to make a statement and make an arrest or seek an arrest warrant if appropriate." Now the way that the narrative reads and the initial investigation report that Deputy Dannell completed, it suggests that this injury to could have happened by stepping on her foot. Do you know of any point in time any attempt was made by Deputy Dannell or anybody else to contact that otherwise we're unaware of or wasn't documented in the report?

No, my understanding of, of again, both the report and in speaking with Deputy Dannell, this was kind of a, um, these injuries may have happened when he was trying to stop her from breaking her stuff, but there was no intentional violence, um, and that was, that was, uh, I think mentioned by both of their statements. He wasn't sure, you know, he believed it was incidental and he didn't wanna participate in any domestic violence and she, I believe, uh, also stated that it could a been incidental.

Lt. Pippin: Mm hmm.

Sgt Uh, there was no known intention and she couldn't recall an intentional act.


Lt. Pippin: Mm hmm, and, and I'll, again, going back, just for the record, um, just wanna note that, Deputy Dannell learned of these injuries to after the fact, after they left the residence and no longer had contact.

Sgt Correct.

Lt. Pippin: With, with Okay.

Sgt That's correct.

Lt. Pippin: Um, moving down a little bit, Subsection J, "Deputy should take appropriate enforcement action when there's probable cause to believe an offense has occurred. Factors that should not be used as sole justification for declining taking enforcement action include" and it goes on to list a bunch a things, but it, at, at a point that night, during that investigation, our office and Deputy Dannell did, um, have probable cause to believe that an offense had occurred.



Lt. Pippin: Is it, is that the way we train our staff?

Sgt Uh, me personally, no. Uh, in fact I just went over it with a training officer this week. Hey, I know you did it, put it in the report.

Lt. Pippin: Okay.

Sgt Um, so no.

Lt. Pippin: Is it, would it, would it be, would it be common, matter of fact, uh, would it be our practice, um, that when we train people when they, when they prepare reports that those things that we're obligated and mandated to do by statute, such as the Marsy's pamphlet, domestic violence information letter, that we document those things in the report to, well to document that we actually in fact did them?

Sgt Um, we train that way, and it's, and it's, uh, common for people to do that but it's also not uncommon for people to not put it in the report.

Lt. Pippin: Mm hmm. As a supervisor, when reading one of those reports, would it be fair to say that they should be, um, kicked back for, for lack of better terms or at least have the deputy go back and fix that report to make sure that they're in there?

Sgt Yes, my, my practice is generally to tell 'em hey, I notice you didn't put this in there. I need you to add a line.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Going back to some of the FTO stuff and the things that are kinda missing from this report and some of the, um, ab, abnora, ab.

Sgt Normalities.

Lt. Pippin: Normalities, thank you. I don't know why I can't say big words today. Um, uh, going into the standard evaluation, standardized evaluation guidelines for the FTO program, we go over things such as knowledge of criminal statutes, knowl, knowledge of department policy and procedures, forms for accuracy and completeness.

Sgt Mm hmm.

Lt. Pippin: Um, codes of criminal procedure investigative skill, problem solving, decision making, a lot of these different things. Uh, when it comes to this report – well, first let me ask this. W, after you get out of the FTO program, do those standards that we teach stop when FTO's completed?

Sgt No.

Lt. Pippin: It's an easy one, right? Um, these basic standards are what we expect for somebody to clear FTO and become, um, a solo beat deputy, right? The basic, basic, basic level to perform at a solo beat deputy level.

J. Jasmine: There's a nod yes.

Sgt Yeah. Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Correct. Okay. When you th, when you, we've gone over this report, some of the things that it lacks especially when it comes to, uh, department policy and procedures, would you say that this report, and I'll give you a couple a categories because I'm telling you right now, I don't think it's superior but you may, but when it comes to what the guidelines are for a solo beat deputy, um, acceptable would be "familiar with most commonly applied department policies, regulations and/or procedures. Unacceptable – fails to display knowledge of department policies, regulations and/or procedures or violates the same." Which one of those categories would you place that report in?

Sgt Do you mind if I review the report, report real quick?

Lt. Pippin: Not at all.

Lt. Vasquez: Also, um, Jason, for the record too, that I just wanna outline that, um, Sergeant is reading the actual report, um, and we're, we're asking for his opinion just based on the report, not based on any conversations that may have also taken place.

J. Jasmine: Understood. And , you understand that as well? In other words, you're to give –

Sgt Yes.

J. Jasmine: - feedback on just the report -

Sgt Just the report.

J. Jasmine: - itself.

Lt. Vasquez: And there'll be a question about how you approve reports and do you take that into consideration later.

Sgt Um, based on my review, um, the report documents my understanding of the incident, uh, but it has issues.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Let me, let me just kinda, we'll walk through some of those, um, and I'll ask you for your opinion based on, uh, what you just read and maybe some information that I can glean from, from what I know as well and, uh, see what your response would be to that. Um, understanding knowledge of department policies and procedures and some of those policies we

just went through with the, in reference to domestic violence and what you just read, would you say that that report is unacceptable or acceptable? And una, unacceptable meaning it fails to display knowledge of department policies, regulations and/or procedures. Um, and acceptable meaning that that report reflects a familiarity, familiar, arity with most commonly applied department policies, regulations and/or procedures.

Sgt Um, I would say that it actually reflects a familiarity, um, and that he addresses the, the paperwork. However, he did not do it so.

Lt. Pippin: Keep in mind that there's things like, uh, injuries that were not documented. They were not photographed.

Sgt Right. Those, no, those are, those are, um, collection of evidence, there's issues, uh, but as far as what was written, the, the written work, um, it shows a familiarity with the, the process and that he, uh, speaks about, at least with the, the paperwork. Uh, however, he didn't do it so it does in fact violate policy. Um, there's certain papers that they can refuse to sign and, and refuse to participate in but the basic domestic violence packet we're still supposed to give them.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. So speaking of forms, one of the things that we teach people and for them to maintain or, or operate under, um, the level of a solo beat deputy are, uh, under routine forms for accuracy and completeness. It says, "An un, unacceptable level is unaware that a form must be completed and/or unable to complete the proper form given the situation, acceptable meaning knows of commonly used forms, understands their use, completes them with reasonable accuracy and thoroughness." Would you say that that's an acceptable report or unacceptable?

Sgt Well the basic fact is he didn't do 'em so it would fall under unacceptable, uh, although it is a lot more common.

Lt. Pippin: Um, let's talk about knowledge of codes and criminal procedure. Part of that, we talk about what we teach these guys in the academy. Part of that is 849, the release of, uh, arrest from custody. I just wanna clarify that there's no dispute that she was taken into custody and arrested.

Sgt Correct.

Lt. Pippin: Correct? Um, I will remind you that that report, there's no paperwork attached to it as an attachment, nor does it mention the paperwork being filled out about, uh, a 849, release from custody form. Is it true that we train guys when they have somebody in custody and they're gonna be released that they be released pursuant to 849, uh, being that we have the paperwork that's supposed to be filled out?

Yes, and in this case, um, you know, Deputy Dannell was told, uh, that's what a 849B is for, um, and, you know, uh, my understanding was that there was going to be, uh, an additional follow-up report documenting that, it didn't happen.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Just based on the, the, but the original report speaks of her being released from custody.

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Correct? But there's no paperwork to suggest –

Sgt Correct.

Lt. Pippin: - it was done appropriately.

Sgt Correct.

Lt. Pippin: Having that in mind, would you say that that's acceptable or unacceptable by standards in \*\*\*\*?

Sgt Unacceptable.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Do we allow – let me rephrase that. When investigating, uh, accusations of domestic violence and somebody has injuries, is it ever an option not to document those injuries by way of photographic evidence? In other words, if somebody says I don't want you to take pictures of 'em, what's a typical response?

Um, does that happen? Yes. Uh, you, you attempt to get them to allow you to. Uh, does it happen that people refuse? Yes, and then we do end up not having pictures? Yes. Um, are we supposed to, again, do, do our due diligence? Hey, you know, explain to 'em that, you know, I know this is how you're feeling right now, but at least let us document what it looks like tonight. It may be worse tomorrow, you know, and, and to try to explain it to get their, their consent. Yes, we typically do that, but it is often that people just simple refuse and we don't get those pictures.

Lt. Pippin: And we have things and, and it even stated in policy and things that, and ways that we can go about doing that to make people feel more comfortable such as having somebody of the same sex take the photograph —

Sgt Correct.

Lt. Pippin: – for you, right.

Sgt Correct.

Lt. Pippin: In this case, no photographs were taken the night of the incident, and I'll stick just with that because the supplemental report, you weren't a part of. Um, but based on the investigation that was conducted, the injuries that were spoken of but not documented accordingly, um, would you say that that is unacceptable or acceptable, and if you need clarification on what those standards I can read them for you.

I would say it's, it's unacceptable that he didn't get the, the picture. However, my Sgt understanding, uh, as to why it was that Mr. was not going to participate, um, with any part of the investigation to include photographs or, uh, documentation in the form of paperwork. Okay, and just for clarification, we do have photographs of Mr. Lt. Pippin: Okay. Sgt They were attached to the report. Lt. Pippin: Okay. Sgt were not. Lt. Pippin: Um, Mrs., Mrs. Okay. I'm talking about her foot. Sgt Lt. Pippin: Yeah. Sgt Okay. All right. Let's move on to, uh, do you have anything? Lt. Pippin: Lt. Vasquez: I have one question just about the, um, reports and I hope, I hope I don't step on anybody but -

Lt. Pippin: Not at all.

Lt. Vasquez: — I felt like it's in this, um, realm. When approving reports, um, are you just looking at the report on face value and determining whether or not you're going to approve it, or do you take into consideration, um, as you compare and contrast things that you may have heard while you were on scene or other conversations that you had with arresting deputies, does that come into your mind when you're approving reports at all?

I think absolutely it does. I think it's impossible to separate, uh, knowledge in your head and, and as you're reading something, uh, that knowledge overlays with what you're reading on the page so, yes, conversations that I'd already had, uh, made the report read, uh, clearer to me because I had some of the missing information, not realizing that it is in fact missing. It was in my head.

Lt. Vasquez: That's all I had.

Lt. Pippin: Um, I, I may come back to the report but, uh, at this point I wanna move, move on from there. Uh, wanna talk about some of the activity post report, post that investigation. Um, and I'm sure as you, as you've probably been told by, uh, your representation, we have done some other investigations, um, interviews I should say, in this, in this internal investigation so

some of this information has been gleaned through that, and I just wanna go over some of it with you. Um, we talked about what the duties are of watch commander. You clarified that. Couple questions about that though. When, we're unique here, right. When, when, especially when you consider like graveyard, which you're the sergeant of, no, nobody else is around on graveyard. Lieutenants aren't around. The Sheriff, Under Sheriff. It's basically just you. Um, as the watch commander in those certain situations, are you the supervisor of the communication in the absence of that rank and file being there?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Are you the supervisor of custody in the absence of those people being there?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Were you aware, and I believe you are, I don't know that you're aware of the circumstances, but were you aware that Deputy Dannell met with contwo occasions in the 48 hours after the original incident? So the night of the 17<sup>th</sup> is when you guys all responded to the residence, and that two times, over the next 48 hours, Deputy Dannell met with and that they, they were documented in a supplemental report. However, the locations were not, uh, provided, but were you aware that he had met with her?

Sgt I was aware that he had met with her once.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Did he tell you where he met with her? What the purpose of, of that was for?

Um, he said that they met, um, and they discussed the events, um, and he further believed there was, uh, that she might be a victim, um, and that she, well that's, that's all I really recall. He didn't, he might a said it was at, at their house. I don't, I don't recall.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Did you speak with Deputy Dannell at any time? Let me be more specific. I wrote this question down. I need to be more specific 'cause he's on your shift so of course you spoke to him after you were served with your notice. Did you speak with Deputy Dannell at any time after being served with your notice of investigation about this case, um, or anything specific about, um, the investigation?

Sgt Absolutely not.

Lt. Pippin: Were you aware that after you advised Deputy Dannell to not have contact with under any circumstances, that he contacted her that night and questioned why she filed a complaint or why she made statements to her husband which resulted in a complaint being filed against him?

Sgt I was not aware of that until you just said that.

Lt. Pippin: At any time after the incident, uh, as, as I say incident I'm referencing the July 17<sup>th</sup>, at any time after the incident and two follow-up interviews that we spoke about that he conducted with her, specifically after you instructed Deputy Dannell to not have any further contact with did Deputy Dannell ask permission to contact her at any time?

Sgt Not once.

Lt. Pippin: Deputy Dannell has, has been assigned to the Groveland beat periodically, um, under your watch. Is it common for the Groveland deputy to be in service but centrally located in the county?

Sgt Yes, depending on call volume. Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Correct. Outside of priority calls, so let's say call volume is normal and there's no priority calls, is it common practice for the Groveland deputy to remain in Groveland?

Sgt Yes.

Lt. Pippin: Were you aware, or were you made aware, that while working the Groveland beat on several different occasions after the incident, Deputy Dannell drove to residence and made contact with her, after you ordered him not to contact her?

Sgt No, I was not aware of that.

Lt. Vasquez: And just, just for clarification, that's not isolated to just Deputy Dannell working Groveland. He could've also worked the 4 or the 3 or the 1 or any beat associated with that, but specifically, were you aware that he had had that contact?

Sgt No.

Lt. Pippin: Were you aware or were you made aware that on at least two occasions Deputy Dannell responded to residence for calls for service after the incident, after he was contacted personally via his cell phone and these incidents were not documented? They were incidents that occurred after you instruction, instructed him to have, not have contact with her.

Sgt I was absolutely not aware.

Lt. Pippin: Um, if a deputy calls off on a patrol check in a certain area, other than you physically being present when that pa, when that patrol check is, is put out let's say over the radio, um, is it normal to assume that the deputy is in fact where he or she states they are doing that patrol check?

Sgt Yes. I, uh, I actually instruct my guys to go do patrol checks when there's not a call so that the public can see us in their neighborhoods and I assume, uh, that's where they are.

If I happen to be driving, uh, sometimes I can see 'em on the map, and yeah, that's where are, and depending on how far that is from me and the setting on my map. And I think it would be safe to assume that as the patrol watch commander when Lt. Pippin: somebody calls off on a patrol check, that you would trust that that's where they are and what they're doing. Sgt Absolutely. Right. You spoke about the map and a way to confirm and see if they're there. Is Lt. Pippin: that something that you do -Sgt Yes-Lt. Pippin: - every -- I periodically check my map, uh, as I patrol, uh, to ensure where my guys are. Sgt Lt. Pippin: Periodically. Uh, it's, it's, it's only a, a function that's available in the vehicle, um, and I don't Sgt make a habit of checking it while my vehicle's moving, but periodically, yes, I'll stop. I'll pull up the map. Hey, my, my numbers are where they're supposed to be. Mm hmm, and it saves, oftentimes as a watch commander, you're in the office Lt. Pippin: behind the computer and, like you said, the desktops don't sh, have that feature. Correct? Correct. Sgt Correct. Were you aware or were you made aware that on numerous occasions Lt. Pippin: over several months after the initial incident that Deputy Dannell was turning off his MDC as to hide his GPS location while calling off on random patrol checks, while visiting her residence? No, I was not, not aware. Not at all. Sgt

Were you aware or made aware that on no less than ten occasions, Deputy Lt. Pippin: residence and had sex with her while on duty? Dannell drove to

No, I was not aware. Sgt

Were you aware or were you made aware that after being told to not have contact Lt. Pippin: that Deputy Dannell met with her while attending range instructor school with where they shared a hotel room and engaged in sexual intercourse?

I was not aware. Sgt

reached out to you about alleged misconduct Lt. Pippin: At any time has invol, concerning David Dannell? Sgt No. Were you aware or at any time made aware that Deputy Dannell was using three Lt. Pippin: different cell phones on duty, one of which was a cell phone purchased for him by to conceal his communications with her? No, I was not aware. Sgt Can we take a quick break? Lt. Pippin: Sure. You want us to step out or are you stepping out? J. Jasmine: Lt. Pippin: Um J. Jasmine: Either way's fine Yeah, that's fine. Lt. Pippin: Lt. Vasquez: Why don't we let them \*\*\*\*. Okay. Resuming recording there. We're back after a short little recess. Just a Lt. Pippin: couple of things, Sergeant I wanted to clarify. You had talked about being able to look at the mapping system within RIMS and figure out where guys are at. Um, are you aware of any indicators that would suggest to you that somebody has turned their MDC off? Um, I know when somebody's MDC is on there's a hashtag or something like that. Sgt If it, if it was s, I think the way I was trained is if they sign on with their MDC it puts a hashtag or, um, or the person logging it on if it's done from, um, from, over the air via dispatch. They can put the hashtag there to show you it's there -Lt. Pippin: Okay. - or the pound sign. Sgt Do you under, from your understanding, does that hashtag signify whether or not Lt. Pippin: their MDC is on or off? No. Uh, my understanding is that it means that vehicle has an MDC. Sgt Okay. So that's not something you typically look at? Lt. Pippin: No. Sgt

Lt. Pippin: To figure out if somebody –

Sgt No.

Lt. Pippin: – would or would not be.

No, our policy, uh, and I'm very well aware of it because I, I drove a car for, uh, months with an MDC that would routinely just shut off, and in fact my current car, uh, the only way to fix that was to disable all shutoffs on mine. Um, our policy states that if it does go off, you are supposed to grab the radio and immediately notify dispatch so that they know you have lost those resources, um, so, you know, I don't generally check that. Um, I just check hey, they're there. They're where they're supposed to be.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Um, were you, has anybody ever come to you with any c, uh, complaints or alleged, uh, any alleged in regards to Deputy Dannell other than the complaint you received from dispatch via, or via dispatch from

Sgt Has anyone ever come to me? No.

Lt. Pippin: In other words, let me, let me specify a little better. Have you, have you taken any complaints in regards to Deputy Dannell, um, or his behavior while on duty from anybody else other than the one that we spoke about?

Sgt Not that I can recall. Um, I don't recall taking any citizen complaints. Um, I don't recall taking any personnel complaints. Um, no.

Lt. Pippin: Okay. Lieutenant Vazquez, anything from you?

Lt. Vasquez: Yes. I, I had, I had a question that popped into my mind and kinda just went away, but give me a second.

Lt. Pippin: No problem.

Lt. Vasquez: Um, it's gone. \*\*\*\*. That's it.

J. Jasmine: Well if it's important and it comes back, uh, reach out to me and we'll respond.

Lt. Vasquez: Okay.

Lt. Pippin: All right. I'm gonna go ahead and, uh, stop the recording now.




The particular facts of this recommendation were identified during the internal affairs investigation (Internal Affairs Investigation #19-004); a copy of that report is attached. A summary of the internal affairs investigation findings are as follows.

You have been employed with the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office for approximately 14 years as a Deputy Sheriff and currently hold the rank of Sergeant. The rank of Sergeant is a supervisor position. You have been, a Corporal/ Field Training Officer (FTO) for one year, which is also a supervisory position. You currently hold an Intermediate POST Certificate. You have held this rank for one year. While in the academy a learning domain on domestic violence was covered which you successfully completed/passed. You successfully completed the field training program, part of which contains a block of instruction and training on domestic violence. During your career, you stated that you have handled no less than 50 domestic violence investigations which you classified as a "common call".





Your failure to supervise and/or recognize inappropriate behavior from David Danel while investigating the complaint from and actions while doing so, was in direct violation of numerous governing policies of the Sheriff's Office, the DSA MOU and the County of Tuolumne rules and regulations [TCSO Policy 201 Command and Authority, Policy 340.3.6 Standards of conduct, efficiency (a)(b), TCSO Policy 444 Watch Commanders, TC PR&R Rule 9, Disciplinary Action, Section B. Cause(s) of Action (16), DSA MOU Article 16, Section C. Cause(s) of Action (4)(5)(15)].

### **CONCLUSION:**

Based on your conduct during the events on and after 07/17/2019, described above and in the attached internal affairs report, you violated the above-referenced personnel rules and policies.

Your failure to provide the basic level functions of a Deputy Sheriff Sergeam disrupted the efficiency of the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office. As a sworn Peace Officer, and as a supervisor holding the rank of Sergeant, you are held to a high standard. You are entrusted by the public to display the highest level of professional skill.

Violation of these requirements, therefore, place the agency and others at considerable risk and it leaves the agency with little choice other than to discipline you. Therefore, I am proposing to suspend you without pay for 120 hours and mandate you to attend a POST certified Assertive Supervision Couse (24 hours).

### APPEAL RIGHTS

Pursuant to Skelly, you have the right to appeal this action to Sheriff Bill J. Pooley, either verbally or in writing within seven (7) calendar days after service of this notice. Although the pre-disciplinary conference is not designed to be a formal evidentiary hearing, you may be represented by legal counsel or another individual of your choice. You may provide statements from yourself, written statements of any witnesses and other documentary material. Your failure to provide a written response or to request a pre-disciplinary conference will constitute a waiver of your right to provide a response. Accordingly, the Sheriff's decision to either sustain, modify, or reject this recommendation will be based upon a review of this Notice of Intent and its attachments.

### WARNING AGAINST RETALIATION

This provision is to notify you it is illegal and inappropriate to retaliate against any person who has participated in complaining or providing information regarding the allegations against you as set forth above and in the attached Internal Affairs Investigation.

On March 3, 2020, we held a *Skelly* meeting in my office where you and your attorney, Jason Jasmine, were both present. The purpose of the *Skelly* meeting was to consider your response to the *Notice of Proposed Discipline* dated Febuary 4, 2020, and determine whether it is appropriate to proceed with the proposed discipline of a 120 hours suspension without pay. After carefully considering all the facts and argument presented at the *Skelly* meeting, including the facts outlined in the *Notice of Proposed Discipline*, I find you violated the policies referenced below. However the discipline is reduced as explained below.

You are hereby notified that the Tuolumne County Sheriff's Office is suspending you for 30 Hours without pay.

The remaining 46 hours will be held in obeyance for a period of one year, starting March 25, 2020. Should you violate any of the policies sustained in this order, you will serve the 46 hours in addition to any discipline associated with the new violations up to and including termination.

Within the next 6 months, you will be assigned to take a POST certified Assertive Supervision Couse (24 hours). Within two weeks of completing the course you will prepare a detailed report on the lessons learned, how those lesson should be applied to our office to reduce liability and how those lesson could have helped you prevent the incidents outlined in this Internal Affairs investigation. The report will provide feedback and recommendations to me on whether or not we should continue to send our supervisors to the class.

If your report is not completed on time or lacks the detail on the information requested you will serve an additional 10 hours without pay.



You have been, a Corporal/Field Training Officer (FTO) for one year, which is also a supervisory position. You currently hold an Intermediate POST Certificate. You have held this rank for one year.



This investigation started as a result of a citizen's complaint that was filed by
about July 21st, 2019, contacted Dispatch and requested to file a complaint alleging an
inappropriate relationship between David Danel and his wife Over the course of numerous weeks
following the complaint, Dispatchers who were aware of the complaint recognized a pattern of behavior
from David Danel which caused alarm. The behavior included David Danel being at or near the
residence while on duty (shown by patrol car MDC/GPS), as well as David Danel turning off his patrol
car MDC/GPS while near Dispatcher reported this information to
Sergeant who in turn notified Lt David Vasquez.
On July 17 <sup>th</sup> , 2019, former Deputy Sheriff David Danel was charged with the duties of working as a patrol deputy. You were charged with the duties of the watch commander and were directly supervising David Danel. Both of you were assigned to the graveyard watch, between the hours of 1800 and 0600.
At approximately 1950 hours David Danel was dispatched to a domestic disturbance at the residence of and and the arrived on scene at 2005 hours. You also responded to the scene and
arrived approximately 9 minutes after David Danel. During an investigation at the scene, David Danel
developed probable cause to arrest for felony domestic violence as well as delaying and
obstructing. This decision was supported by evidence obtained by David Danel including visible injuries
actions at the scene and statements from





There are numerous factual misrepresentations in the report authored by David Danel surrounding his decision to release from custody. There is no mention of David Danel leaving the jail for over an hour and later being summoned back to transport for medical clearance at the request of the jail nurse. In the report, David Danel indicates he learned about the injury to foot while interviewing her when he was completing the booking process. His report indicates he immediately notified the jail nurse who examined the injury and requested be seen for medical clearance [TCSO] Policy 201 Command and Authority, Policy 340.3.6 Standards of conduct, efficiency (a)(b), TCSO Policy 444 Watch Commanders, TC PR&R Rule 9, Disciplinary Action, Section B. Cause(s) of Action (16), DSA MOU Article 16, Section C. Cause(s) of Action (4)(5)(15)]. Per TCSO dispatch records, David Danel cleared the jail at 2144 hours and gave a case disposition of an arrest being made. This was after he completed the booking process. He was summoned back to the jail to transport to AHS for medical clearance at the request of the jail nurse and arrived at 2249 hours. All the information David Danel obtained from relative to the domestic violence incident (statements) came prior to him coming back to transport her for medical clearance. It is evident David Danel omitted information from his report to avoid the appearance of releasing from custody, as a professional courtesy. Rather he chose to give the appearance of him making his decision based on information he developed during his interview with to, and during booking. David Danel already had all relevant information when he made the decision to and close out the call with an arrest made. It is evident his decision to release from custody was not based on lack of probable cause, rather on the potential embarrassment she would face by being seen at the hospital, and by her admission, "as a professional courtesy". Several procedures and required forms were ignored or never mentioned in the report, such as documentation of injuries (photographs) and written documentation supporting from custody. David Danel also cited 847(c) PC, which does not exist, as a governing section which would allow to be released from custody. You failed to recognize inconsistencies and misrepresentations of facts when you reviewed and approved David Danel's report, the same facts Sergeant found "alarming" when he reviewed the report later. When asked to review the report again during your interview, you agreed the report did not meet the field training requirements required of a solo beat deputy [TCSO Policy 201 Command and Authority, Policy 340.3.6 Standards of conduct, efficiency (a)(b), TCSO Policy 444 Watch Commanders, TC PR&R Rule 9, Disciplinary Action, Section B. Cause(s) of Action (16), DSA MOU Article 16, Section C. Cause(s) of Action (4)(5)(15)].

Sergeants are tasked with reviewing and approving reports prepared by deputies to ensure they are factually accurate, contain the required documentation to support charges, and to ensure department policies and procedures have been followed. You demonstrated unsatisfactory work performance when you failed to recognize the inconsistencies and misrepresentation of facts in the report authored by David Danel [TCSO Policy 201 Command and Authority, Policy 340.3.6 Standards of conduct, efficiency (a)(b), TCSO Policy 444 Watch Commanders, TC PR&R Rule 9, Disciplinary Action, Section B. Cause(s) of Action (16), DSA MOU Article 16, Section C. Cause(s) of Action (4)(5)(15)].
