Events Prior to Removal

Report of suspected child abuse or nealect



Investigation



Safety and risk assessment

If a child is removed from their home, placement is identified and Dependency Court Hearings are initiated.

Detention Hearing

Juvenile Dependency Court

Focus: Ensure safety and well-being of children who are alleged to have been abused, neglected, or abandoned.

Confidential: Unlike many court proceedings which are public, these hearings restrict attendance to the parties involved, their legal representatives, and sometimes specific authorized persons.

A DETENTION HEARING

is an initial court proceeding that occurs shortly after a child has been removed from their home.

Jurisdiction Hearing

A JURISDICTION HEARING

occurs following the Detention hearing. The hearing is to determine whether the allegation(s) of abuse or neglect are true and if the court should take jurisdiction over the child.

Disposition Hearing

A DISPOSITION HEARING

If the Court finds the allegation(s) to be true at the Jurisdiction hearing and sustains the petition, a Disposition hearing is scheduled to determine what course of action the court will take.

- Family Reunification: Child remains in out-ofhome care
- Family Maintenance: Child returned home
- No Services: Court will set a hearing to determine a permanent plan

What you can Expect

Continuances: This is when a hearing or trial is postponed to a later date





Contested Hearings: This is a court proceeding where the facts of the case are disputed, and both parties present evidence and arguments to support their positions.

Questions: Expect to have questions. Communicate with your social worker.



Visitation

- Parents have a right to visitation
- Visitation maintains family connection
- Visits with extended family members

The agency will keep you informed of the current visitation and any changes in visitation.











Placement of a Child

Family Finding is a dedicated effort by the agency to locate and engage relatives or other significant connections for children placed in outof-home care.

> The Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) is a federal law that requires a child to be placed according to the preference of the Tribe. ICWA applies when the child is a member of, or eligible for membership in, a federally recognized tribe.

Juvenile Dependency Cases are CONFIDENTIAL

Status Review Hearings

6 Month Status Review

After the Disposition, Status Review Hearings are set every 6 months.



12 Month Status Review



18 Month Status Review

If family reunification services are terminated, the Court will set a hearing to determine a Permanent Plan.
