

How to vote a ballot

Use a blue or black pen to mark the bubble to the left of your choice. Do not use pencil. Important! Fill in the bubble completely. Do not make other marks on your ballot.

Candidate: Fill in the bubble to the left of the candidate's name.

Write-in candidate: Fill in the bubble to the left of the line and write the person's name. Important! If a candidate's name is already on the ballot, do not write it in.

Measure: Fill in the bubble to the left of Yes or No.

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS:

- To vote you must completely darken the oval next to your choice.
- If you make a mistake or prefer a Spanish ballot, contact the Elections Office at (209) 533-5570 or ask the precinct officer at your polling location.
- To vote for a qualified person whose name is not on the ballot, completely darken the oval AND write in the qualified name on the write-in line for that race.

Voter-Nominated and Nonpartisan Offices
All voters, regardless of the party preference they disclosed upon registration, or refusal to disclose a party preference, may vote for any candidate for a voter-nominated or nonpartisan office. The party preference, if any, designated by a candidate for a voter-nominated office is selected by the candidate and is shown for the information of the voters only. It does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party or that the party approves of the candidate. The party preference, if any, of a candidate for a nonpartisan office does not appear on the ballot.

How to return a vote-by-mail ballot

Return your vote-by-mail ballot:

-  By mail: 2 S Green St, Sonora, Ca 95370
-  By hand at our office: 2 S Green St, Sonora, Ca
-  By hand to a polling location on **June 7**

If hand delivered, vote-by-mail ballots must be received at our office or a polling location by Election Day, 8pm. If mailed, it must be postmarked by Election Day, and received within 3 days.
