### ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

The CRA Engineering Staff has been very successful in obtaining federal and state grants for a variety of road improvement projects. The following projects are anticipated to be scheduled for construction in 2017:

- ♦ Hardin Flat Road Bridge Replacement Project. This project will replace the existing fire damaged bridge with a single span concrete box girder bridge. The total project cost is estimated to be \$2.9 million.
- ◆ Jacksonville Road Bridge Preventative Maintenance Project. This project entails grinding and replacing the existing deck overlay with a polyester concrete overlay, replacing the deck joint seals, and other associated improvements at an estimated cost of \$1.3 million.
- ♦ Bridge Preventative Maintenance Project (BPMP). Eleven bridges will receive preventative maintenance treatments through this project, including methacrylate and polyester concrete deck treatments, reconstruction of bridge approaches, and associated improvements. The estimated cost of this project is \$1.1 million.



- ◆ Intersection Improvements to Parrotts Ferry Road and SR 49. This project includes roadway widening and reconstruction, elimination of the right-hand turn "swing lane," and other associated improvements. The estimated cost of this project is \$1.08 million.
- ♦ Fifth Avenue Signalization Project. This project entails installing a traffic signal, reconstructing the roadway and other associated improvements at the intersection of Fifth Avenue and State Route 108 in Jamestown at an estimated total cost of \$2.3 million.
- ◆ Tuolumne Park and Ride Project. This project will develop the existing Tuolumne Parks and Recreation District (TPRD) gravel lot into a paved parking lot with 56 striped parking spaces and improved lighting and drainage. The new parking lot will serve as a park-and-ride facility for users of the nearby bus stop, as well as serving the users of the Tuolumne Park and Recreation District facilities and the nearby trail network. The total project cost is estimated to be \$319,000.
- ◆ Yankee Hill Road and Parrots Ferry Road Reconstruction Project. This project will install the last asphalt overlay of the Parrotts Ferry Road Reconstruction Project and also reconstruct a portion of Yankee Hill Road at a cost of \$1.1 million.
- ◆ Special Districts Pavement 2016 Project. This project will provide pavement pre-

ventative maintenance by use of a microsurfacing treatment for the following County Service Area (CSA) and Permanent Road Division (PRD) roads: CSA 10 Monte Grande Heights, CSA 20 Cedar Ridge, CSA 28 Rough and Ready, CSA 32 Ridgewood, CSA 43 Black Oak Estates, CSA 47 Cherry Valley, CSA 48 Sonora Vista Estates, CSA 53 Whispering Woods, CSA 56 Mill Villa Manor, and CSA 59 Mountain Vista. If funding is available, work will be extended to CSA 36 Columbia Vista, CSA 40 Sunnvhill, and CSA 51 Twain Harte Heights. The estimated project cost is \$864,460.

- ◆ Retrofit Regulatory and Warning Signs. This project involves retrofitting regulatory and warning signs along County maintained roads to meet new federal reflectivity requirements. The total cost of this project is estimated to be \$609,000.
- ♦ Pinecrest Transfer Station Parking Lot Improvements. This project will reconstruct the Pinecrest Transfer Station parking lot by rehabilitating the contact water sump, constructing a contact water apron and curbing, extending a retaining wall, re-grading slopes and repairing or resurfacing the roadway. This project has a total estimated cost of \$194,100.
